So many records are available online that as I researched my husband, Bryce Leon Munger's line from Samuel, second son of Nicholas, I could not ignore the information I found. 247. iv. James Munger (John, Samuel, Joseph, Samuel, Nicholas)

Born: 12 Dec 1772 ®(birth date calculated from death date on grave stone. see findagrave.com)

1790 - James, age 18, lived Fishkill, Dutchess Co, NY, at home with all brothers and parents (see 64. John)

1799 - married in Fishkill, Dutchess, NY, Margaret Devine ® Records of the Dutch Reformed Church of Fishkill, Marriages [1731-1850], p. 27. Ancestry.com. Note: sp. Monger.

1800 - lived Fishkill, Dutchess, NY with 3 in household: 1 M 26-44 James; 1 F 16-25 Margaret; 1 F 45 and over mother or mother-in-law; no children ® 1800 Census: Fishkill, Dutchess, New York; Series: M32; Roll: 21; Page: 40; Image: 45; FHL Film: 193709, Ancestry.com.

1800 - Brother John Munger lived in next dwelling with 2 males under 10, 1 male 16-26, 2 females under 10, 1 female 26-45. ®see 1800 census above

1800 - Brother William Munger lived nearby with 1 male under 10, 1 male 16-26, 1 female 16-26. ®see 1800 census above

1804 - James lived Fishkill under spelling Monger where son William H. was baptised. ®U.S., Dutch Reformed Church Records in Selected States, 1639-1989. Holland Society of New York, Fishkill, Book 14A. Ancestry.com

1810 - James lived Harpersfield, Delaware Co., New York with his family of nine: 5 males under 10: Christian 9, William H. 7, Tillotson 4, James 2, Abram S. 2 mos.; 1 male 26-40, James 38; 1 female under 10: Mariah 6; 1 female 26-44 Margaret 34; 1 female 45 and over, James's

mother Millicent ? @ 1810 Census, Harpersfield, Delaware, New York; Roll: 26; Page: 492; Image: 00251; FHL Film 0181380. Ancestry.com.

1820 - James lived Waterford, Susquehanna Co., Pennsylvania with his wife and family of eight children: Christian 19, William H. 17, Mariah 16, Tillotson 14, James 12, Abram S. 10, John D. 8, Hiram A. 6, Caroline 2. These ages fit the census categories. @1820 U S Census, *Waterford, Susquehanna, Pennsylvania*; Page: 39; NARA Roll: M33_112; Image: 50, Ancestry.com.

1822 - James lived Ithaca, Tompkins Co., New York where he bought, on 30 October 1822, from Samuel Parcel for \$500.00, 1/2 of Lot 98, Ulysses Military Tract, and 1/2 of saw mill (Other half owned by Asa Wisner) and buildings thereon plus 16 & 3/4 acres. @New York Land Records, 1630-1975, Tompkins, Vol. F., p. 8, Image 10 of 582. familysearch.org

1827 - James bought 40 1/4 acres in Ithaca from Asa Wisner, Jr. for \$400.00. This tract part of great Lot 100, Ulysses Military Tract. @New York Land Records, 1630-1975, Tompkins, Vol. O., p. 40. Image 30 of 549. familysearch.org

1828 - James bought two parcels in Ithaca, 75 acres and 3 acres, adjacent to the mill land from Asa Weiser for \$1250.00. These tracts part of Great Lot 100, Ulysses Military Tract. @New York Land Records, 1630-1975, Tompkins, Vol. O., p. 41, Image 31 of 549. familysearch.org

Note: The town of Ithaca was formed from Ulysses, which was erected as one of the original towns of Onondaga county, March 5, 1794. Its history is traced as Ulysses, Onondaga county, from March 5, 1794; as Ulysses, Cayuga county from March 8, 1799; as Ulysses, Seneca county, from March 29, 1804; as Ulysses, Tompkins county, from April 17, 1817; and as Ithaca, Tompkins county, from March 16, 1821.

1830 - James, wife Margaret and 7 youngest children lived Ithaca, Tompkins, NY. @1830 Census Ithaca, Tompkins, New York; Series: M19; Roll: 109; Page: 354; FHL Film: 0017169. Ancestry.com

1831, 26 August - James died; buried East Lawn Cemetery, Ithaca. @findagrave.com

Will dated 10 May 1831; proved and recorded 25 January 1832. Terms: First, to two sons James Munger and Abraham S. Munger, 75 acres of land purchased from Asa Wisner Senr.; Secondly, to wife Margaret, the remainder of his estate. @New York, U.S., Wills and Probates Records, 1659-1999, Tompkins, Vol A-C, 1817-1839, B: 268-73 , Image 346-8. 1835, April 2 - James's heirs sell his land in Ithaca.

Deed between Margaret Munger, Christian Munger and Maria his wife, William H. Munger and Emily his wife, George Aldrich and Maria his wife, Tillotson Munger and Sybil his wife, James D. Munger and Jane his wife, Abraham S. Munger and John D. Munger of the first part and James McWhorter of the second part: for \$800.00, in the town of Ithaca and Dryden, 115 acres, has a mortgage on the land of \$1200 from the New York Life Insurance Company dated March 30, 1831 which McWhorter pays off at his own expense. In presence of Moses Bingham. Signed by Abraham, John D., James, Jane E., Tillotson, Sybil, Margaret, Christian, William H., Emily A., George Aldrich, Maria Aldrich, Mary Munger. Signed on the 18th of April, and the 13th. Recorded 28 Sept 1835. @ New York Land Records 1630-1975, Tompkins, Deeds BB, p. 472, image 551 of 600, familysearch.org
