Sept. 1974 at Mitchell, IN; Joseph was a pharmacist. At 82 in 1956, the following article was the Mitchell, IN paper. In part it reads, "Joe Munger, who's been dispensing drugs and dry witticisms in Mitchell since 1901, has begun his second-though not necessarily his last -retirement. The occasion was marked with a dinner given by his fellow workers at City

Drug Store. Mr. Munger retired once before back in 1937. This lasted for about 12 years. Then on March 30, 1950, he went back to work. The late Bruce Boyd was sick and Mr. Munger took the job temporarily to enable the store to comply with the state law about having a registered pharmacist on the premises. Mr. Boyd's condition worsened and within a few months he was dead. "Mr. Munger was left to cope with drugs that nine times out of ten were not even in use at the time of his retirement. The sulfas were just beginning to come in 1937, and since then 90 per cent of the drugs werechanged. "Mr. Munger says in the 61 years of his career, he believes the profession of pharmacy has changed more than any other. When he graduated from college in 1895 and when he received his certificate (its number was 51) in Indiana back in 1899, all prescriptions were compounded. (Nowadays the compounding of a prescription is a rarity, to be remarked about.) Quinine and calomel were the principal medicines, and at the old Richardson Drug Store, where Mr. Munger worked from 1901 to 1937, they ordered quinine 100 ounces at a time. Now the City Drug Store orders only one-half ounce. "Root medicines were popular too. Druggists bought gentian root, blood root and yellowroot from small boys, providing them with pocket money, and compounded medicines from them. They also bought a lot of ginseng but shipped it all to China. What the Chinese did with it was never determined, to Mr. Munger's knowledge. "Mr. Munger isn't sure why he wanted to be a pharmacist, unless it was because he suffered from hay fever on the farm where he and his three brothers and two sisters grew up in Ripley County, IN. He chose Ohio Northern University at Ada, OH, becouse it was a poor boy's school. 'And it still is' says Mr. Munger. It is now run by the Methodists. Mr. Munger came to Mitchell in 1901 and pretty soon he met the young school teacher, Miss Beulah Biggs, who was to be Mrs. munger. She says she remembers perfectly the first time she had any conversation with him; she went into Richardson's Drug Store to buy some tickets for the Lyceum course. "And it wasn't very long before he was taking me to the Lyceum lectures,' she says. "Mrs. Munger says she'll be happy to have him around the house all day long. 'He's pretty good company,' she says. 'And I think you should put in something else about him, too,' she told the Tribune reporter. 'You should mention that he's been a Sunday school teacher for more than 50 years. That's the most important thing about him' she went on. 'He's been an influence for good in this community."

Both Mr. and Mrs. Munger have records of teaching Sunday School class at the Methodist church. Mr. Munger first taught a young man's class which was broken up by World War I, then a class of high school students, and now he teaches the men's class. Mrs. Munger's "Most rewarding work" she says, was the class of Methodist girls who thought so much of their teacher that they named the class after her. She began teaching them as soon as they left the primary section and continued as their teacher until some of them were grandmothers. Both Mr. and Mrs. Munger were members of the church choir for many years. Mrs. Munger graduated from Mtsbell High School with the class of 1893 and later attended Southern Indiana Normal College here. She began teaching school at 17, at the old Woodville school.

Raymond was an accountant. The following was taken from the book "Shelby County-History and Families". He came to Shelbyville at the age of 19 to work for Julius Joseph at Albert's Furniture Company as an accountant. He later became a stockholder and Secretary-Treasurer. He married Golda Ice. She worked at the Monte Glove Factory in Indianapolis and Shelbyville as a "floorlady". They met while living at Young's boardinghouse. Ray was a 50 year member of the Masonic Lodge serving as commander. He also belonged to the Scottish Rite. He was a trustee and financial secretary of the First United Methodist Church. Golda was a 50 year member of the Eastern Star and the Domestic Science Club.
