To All Bingham Researchers and Other Users:

This is the last UPDATE. When I start a project, I always finish the project. I started the UPDATE project more than twenty years ago. Now is the right time to finish it for several reasons: all the 1996 books are sold; we have saturated the market; the number of contributors has dwindled; enough records are online so that anyone so motivated can easily do the research; I, myself, need to spend my time doing other things.

There are some caveats: The 1996 book, although still in copyright, will be available to download on a new website in LOCKED PDF in two different formats: 1. by line from Thomas, and 2. by generation. All the UPDATES will be available the same way and place. When that website is ready, I will notify you.

Much is yet to be done. Our Bingham family history is not complete. Every year lost cousins come knocking and every year I find Bingham we didn't know we had. This year I even found Bingham who didn't know they were Bingham, but went by other surnames instead. We also have holes in what we do know. Sometimes a missing death date and place, sometimes a missing marriage date and place. Sometimes a missing occupation, one of great interest and influence.

For this UPDATE our most persistent Bingham researcher, **Brendan J. O'Donnell** has risen to the need of filling the holes in his Joseph 1.10. line and elsewhere also. He feeds me completely resourced material. You will find the work he has done entered here in from Generation Two on through Generation Five. Brendan has also completed the sixth generation. Although his work is not in this UPDATE (it would have taken me another year to finish this UPDATE), it is entered in our master database.

Another Bingham researcher, **James Clifton Bingham, Sr.**, descendant of Abel 1.2., has completed his Bingham line from Ira Augustus (Ira, Edward, Elisha, Jonathan, Abel, Thomas) up to the present time, 2019. We all must applaud Jim for the time he committed and the quality of research he accomplished, not to speak of the clear organization and presentation he submitted to me! Not so incidentally, his cousin, **David Clifton Bingham**, gave him a helping hand. You will find the initial entries for Ira Augustus and others in that line in the 2008-2009 UPDATE, not in the 1996 book. So here we are, updating the UPDATES. Jim's

sources included living knowledge and an old family Bible now in Jim's possession. If you wish to contact Jim or David see @2008 and @2009.

Other contributors we all need to thank for their work are **Daniel Paul Bingham, Eileen Duncan, and Donna Dietz Webb**. They have brought forth Bingham's we had not been able to trace easily.

To all contributors to the 1996 Book and all the UPDATES, I sincerely thank you for your contributions.

For any of you who thought you might contribute if you only had time or knew how to do the research, it is not too late. We still need your help to fill in missing detail, missing bio-sketches, missing people. Whatever you contribute, I will add to the database after verifying its accuracy. Only the UPDATES will not be continued.

You will note that I have changed the formatting in this UPDATE over the course of its preparation, mainly to save time and space. As you read your way through, you will see what the changes are. For example, I stopped listing the direct line ancestors and I stopped including the book chapter and page number for the book entry. These are both easy to find by using the individual's prefix number. In addition to the obvious changes, here are a few to keep in mind: (1) When a fact of any sort is given in conjunction with an obvious federal census year, a formal citation may not be given since it is easy to verify the fact by using any one of several census databases; (2) When a popular genealogy site is cited I have dropped the .com or .org.

Do remember that the UPDATES only work for you if you integrate the entries into the book by making a notation where the update has occurred and where it can be found.

Ann Bingham was born in Norwich, Connecticut in 1677 and moved with her mother and father to Windham Connecticut in 1693. When Ann was almost twenty-two, she married Hezekiah Mason. Hezekiah's grandfather, Major John Mason, had commanded the Connecticut forces in the Pequot War of 1637 and served as Deputy Governor of Connecticut 1660 to 1670. His father, Daniel, Sr., served as Lieutenant and Captain of the New London militia company. Hezekiah, himself, did not serve in a militia company.

Ann and Hezekiah recorded the births of five children, three in Windham and two in Lebanon. The 1860s Mason Family genealogy attributed nine children to Ann and Hezekiah, but gave birth dates for only the five, but two with different names. Since then, researchers have copied one source or another, but never solved the discrepancy. We will simply state what the records show and what the 1860 Mason Family genealogy printed.

Windham records show Rachel, Hannah, Jonathan: Rachel born 12 Apr 1701 and died 2 days later Apr 14; Hannah born 14 June 1702; Jonathan born 30 July 1715. Lebanon records show the birth of another Rachel 20 Nov 1704 and Mary 31 Aug 1707.

The 1860s Mason Family article in the NEHGR gives Rachel and Hannah same as Windham, then Anna born 1704 married Thomas Dimmock of Barnstable; Mary no birth date married David Huntington; Rachael born 31 Aug 1707 married Charles Mudge; Daniel; Jonathan as Windham; Lydia died 7 Oct 1727; Abigail married Jacob Lincoln. @2034

Lebanon was contiguous with Windham. It was not unusual for residents to record vital records where it was most convenient especially if the dwelling was near the town borders.

Recently, a few Mason researchers have attributed some of the children originally assigned to Hezekiah and Ann to one or more of Hezekiah's brothers. Detailed study of original town records is needed.

Ann died 2 Aug 1724. Hezekiah married second, Sarah Robinson, 15 Nov 1725. Hezekiah, however, died the next year, 15 Dec 1726 presumably leaving all Mason-Bingham children born after 1705 in the care of Sarah Robinson.

Abigail and Peter Porter lived in Becket, Berkshire, MA, from at least 1766. Peter was keeper of the tavern on the common in Becket. Obviously highly respected, he was one of five Becket men elected in 1774 to be a committee of correspondence with Boston offering unanimous support to resist unjust British demands. Peter accepted the rank of captain and formed his own

militia company. They marched on 23 April 1775 as part of Col. Paterson's regiment in response to the Lexington Alarm. Peter's company received credit for 29.5 days of service. Peter and his company went on to serve in 1776 as the 5th company in Col. Benjamin Simond's 2nd Berkshire regiment. For a complete list of his revolutionary war service see *Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors in the Revolutionary War*.

Since his first child was born in 1779, Uriah would have been born no later than 1758. So this must be the Uriah who married Eunice Bingham and did not die in 1817. The 1820 U.S. Census shows that Harris and sister Eunice and Urijah Brainard and her brother, Harris, were near neighbors in Lempster. Their children Harris Jr. and Elon Brainard lived close by. Additionally, in 1824 Urijah of Lempster signed a petition objecting to moving the Lempster court to Newport. So did son Elon.]

Harris became a wealthy farmer and was also active in community affairs. Between 1818 and 1821, he represented Lempster in the New Hampshire State Legislature. The 1820 U.S. census shows that Harris and sister Eunice (Urijah Brainard) were near neighbors in Lempster. Their children Harris Jr. and Elon Brainard lived close by.

We can surmise that Harris died unexpectedly in 1822 for he left no will. His entire estate needed to be inventoried before it could be distributed among his heirs. For researchers this presents a treasure trove of material with which to work. For instance, we know that Harris owned six properties, the 18 acres of his home place, the Rogers farm of 150 acres, Shepard's place of 2 acres, the 200 acre farm near Cold River, the Call Land of 44 acres, and a 35 acre lot in the 3rd division of Lempster. The value of his total real estate was \$3,833.31. Harris's personal estate, very completely listed in multiple columns on multiple pages amounted to \$3,077.93. His total worth was calculated as \$6,911.24. Of this, wife Phebe would have received one-third, but she died two years after Harris and before the estate was settled. The land she would have received went to son Theron. By the time the estate was totally settled in May 1824, the living children, Sophia, Courtney, Pamela, Harris, Theron, Minerva, Almira, Talitha, Lucretia, and Rodney each received \$124.73.

From the time she was married until husband Simon died in 1814, Salome lived in the second Congregational Church area of the town of Lebanon, Connecticut known as Columbia. Records for Salome will be found in Lebanon until 1804 when Columbia received independent town status. Both Lebanon and Columbia were in Windham County until 1824 when Lebanon was transferred to New London County jurisdiction. Then in 1827 Columbia was transferred to Tolland County which became Columbia's administrative and judicial headquarters.

Columbia Congregational Church records tell us that Simon, and therefore probably wife Salome, were admitted to membership in November, 1781. An infant child of theirs died in 1784 and another child died in 1786. @1967

In 1790, according to the federal census, Salome and Simon had one male under 16, one male over 16, and 4 females in their household. Census taking began on August 2. The male child would have been John W., born about 1788 and died age 28 in 1811. @1966 Their daughter, Salome, born August 10, 1790 may have been one of the females. The others are not known. @1965

In 1800 Salome and Simon were not enumerated separately on the census. However, they may have been living with Simon's father Henchman Bennet, also a Columbia resident. The enumeration indicates more household members than a 72 year old would have had if others were not living with him. @1972

Both Salome and Simon were over 45 years old in 1810 when the census for Columbia showed them with 1 male 16-25 and 1 female under 10. Who these people were is unknown as son John W. and wife Nancy lived in Norwich, New London County and daughter Salome was 20 years old and probably already married to William H Armstrong. @1970, 1971

Salome's husband, Simon, died on 14 December 1814 aged 59. In his will he left his household furniture and one half of his real estate to wife Salome so long as she remained a widow. The rest of his estate went to daughter Salome and her husband William H. Armstrong who also lived in Columbia at that time. They were to settle his estate and pay all debts. Simon also left a 3 year old heifer with calf to niece Edith Ticknor and a good ewe lamb to Simon Bennet Ticknor. By 1820 Salome and her daughter Salome had merged households and were still living in Columbia. @1962, 1963

Between 1820 and 1830 the extended family left Columbia to settle in Hartwick, Otsego County, New York. The 1830 census lists a family of 12 members. Salome died in 1837 while living in Hartwick and may originally have been buried there, but in after years Otsego County collected all burials from rural cemeteries and transferred them to Cherry Valley Cemetery where Salome is now recorded as interred. @1964

Mary and Daniel lived in Mount Gilead, Morrow Co., OH. They had five children. Daniel's occupation was listed as Gunsmith in 1850, but in 1860 and 1870 he called himself a patent right inventor, perhaps developing better guns. One way or another he made a living sufficient to support a family of five children who all lived into adulthood.

Mary died after husband Daniel whose date and place of death and burial are not among the usual Morrow County records. Thus, it was Mary's will by which her and Daniel's estate was settled. In her will, Mary asked that son Charles H. be appointed executor. She wanted her residence property on Marion Street in Mt. Gilead and all her household goods to go to daughter Inez, not yet married. To son Edgar E., Mary left her forty acre farm in Morrow Township subject to an outstanding mortgage. Edgar was to give his son, Harold, \$200 at age 21. Mary's son Clinton C. was to receive \$400 two years after her death and son Charles H. \$200 three years after her death. He worked in different places until 1837 when he moved on to Kalamazoo, MI. He lived there until 1839. He then went to Rockford, IL and on to Janesville, WI where he married Jane Janes and settled down. They had two children before Jane died in April 1847.

Lucius married again in October, Harriet Leonard. Their child, Jane (also Jennie and Janine) was born about 1848. They had seven more children.

For building a barn for a neighbor, Lucius received a tract of land near Emerald Grove seven and a half miles southeast of his home farm in Harmony. He worked both farms and became a prominent farmer. To him is due the credit of introducing the first Durham cattle in that part of the country. He also raised merino sheep. ®551 Lucius was also reported to have been a postmaster in Rock Co WI in 1866.

Lucius died in 1902. In his will Lucius left all real and personal property to youngest son Elmer Lucius who was also named executor. After wife Harriet died, Elmer was to pay the following legacies: daughter Jennie/Janie Lovelace of Chicago, \$500; son Loyal of Ames, IA \$300; son Charles of Chicago \$800; grandson George Bacon of Milton \$100. The will was proved 18 Mar 1902; probate proceedings began 7 Oct 1902; final settlement did not occur until 1903 and 1904. ®2128

James was a Baptist minister and a farmer. He grew up in Cortland Co., NY where his family had settled before he was thirteen. By the time he was twenty-four, he was married to Sarah Horton who was five years younger than he. Since their first child was born in IL before 24 July 1842, James and Sarah probably moved there from NY soon after their marriage. They lived in Waukegan, Newport Twp., Lake Co., IL through 1853 ®92 In 1854 they moved to Washington Twp., Winneshick Co., IA, in or near Ft. Atkinson ®83

The 1860 census indicates all eight children ranging in age from 2-18 were living at home. They were still there in 1870 ®173 Sons William E. and Theron also lived in Winneshick Co in 1870. The 1870 census shows Serepta, Frank and Emma still living at home. An 1880 agricultural production census shows James as owning 158 acres of land in Washington Township. The 1880 census shows Emma still living at home.

James died in 1881 leaving wife Sarah and all children living. Sarah remained on the farm until she died in 1887. Her will names all the children and the girls' married surnames. She distributed her household goods amongst them and asked that her remaining personal property and all the real property be sold with each child given one equal share of the proceeds. She named son Theron executor. ®2115

Rebecca is a difficult Bingham to research. The spelling of her given name and the spelling of her first husband's surname are inconsistent in records. She married young and had six children by the time she was thirty-one. The family lived first in Mont Vernon, Hillsborough, NH, 1820, then Williamstown, Orange, VT, 1830, and finally Lyndeborough, Hillsborough, NH, 1840. Daniel was a farm laborer.

Before Daniel married Rebecca he had served for a month in the War of 1812. He enlisted as a Private in Cap't Treavitt's company of the New Hampshire Militia on 27 September 1814 and was discharged 9 November 1814. From his second wife's

pension application file we can identify him by the name of his first wife and the date and place of his second marriage and where he lived in 1850 and 1855. @2144

About the time son Henry was born in 1840, Rebecca and Daniel's marriage broke up. Henry may have been Daniel's son by another woman. That woman, Elizabeth Bryer, he married in 1846. In 1850 they lived in Milford, Hillsborough, NH with ten year old Henry and two year old David F. who later was called Frank F.. Daniel and Rebecca's son Charles claimed that he struck out on his own at age nine, about the same time. Where Rebecca lived in 1850 is currently not known.

Rebecca married again in 1853, Stephen Atwood. Stephen was a sixty-three year old wood turner whose first wife had died in 1849. Stephen worked as a wood turner into his eighties. Rebecca worked as a housekeeper and lived to be ninety-six years old.

Solon was a lumberman and lived in several different places following the work. After he married, he and Rachel apparently lived in her home town of Goshen NH for a few years. They then moved to Canada where at least one, maybe two children were born. A little after 1830, they returned to the U.S. and lived in NY State. In 1850, at age forty-five, Solon lived in Poestenkill, Rensselaer, NY. All his children except Sarah were at home and they had three boarders. @2151 In 1860 Solon lived with daughter Laura and her husband Lyman Reynolds in Akron, Peoria, IL @2149 and in 1870 Solon lived with daughter Emma M. and Hiram Benjamin Shane in Peoria, IL. @2150 In 1880 Solon lived with neither daughter, nor do we find him on the 1880 census so we do not know when or where he died.

Wife Rachael had died in New York State in 1855, however we have not found a death record or burial place for her, nor Solon, either. Identifying Rachael is complicated since two Rachael Willey's were born in Goshen in 1805. Yet, by the process of elimination based on the research of Ancestry Tree members this Rachael was probably born 1 January 1805 to Nathan Wiley and Eunice Cary.

Her name was Harriet Sophia hence the name Harriet S.W. in the census.

Asa was a cattle dealer and often went to Boston with large droves. This is probably how Harriet met her future husband, Rufus Proctor, of Chelmsford and lived there. We know little more of Sophia other than she lived with Harriet and Rufus in Chelmsford in 1860 after Asa died.

Asa was eighty-four or five when he died in 1859, but had left a will written in 1835. He left something to each of his children including Harriet. To wife Sophia he left \$100 in household furniture and utensils and \$300 cash as her dower right. @2132

He was 90 years old when he died. By then, Emily's father had died and her eighty-four year old mother, Sarah Foster, lived with them. Harris also employed an Irish born laborer, Thomas Ryan. All living children but George were at home. @92 However, son Charles may actually have been working as a farm hired hand in Fitchburg, Worcester Co. @92

Wife Emily died of cholera in 1863. She was sixty-six years old and visiting or staying with son Charles in Lancaster, Worcester, MA. @2153 After she died, Harris moved to Lancaster, himself, where he lived with son Charles in 1865 and was still with him in 1870. Sometime thereafter, Harris must have returned to Carlisle to live with daughter Maria and husband Josiah Hodgman who were then farming in Carlisle and where Harris died in 1876. In the probate of Harris's will, Maria was granted \$59.25 for clothing she had bought for Harris.

Each of Harris's living sons, Charles, Henry, Harvey received \$200 from his estate and each of his living daughters Caroline and Maria received \$367.00 out of his total estate valued at \$2,030.97. @2143

Almira married Reuben Foster the son of her brother Harris's next door neighbor in Carlisle, MA. In 1830 Almira and Reuben lived only eight dwellings away. @2170 Within the next few years they had moved 6.5 miles northwest of Carlisle to a farm in Westford, Middlesex County. Reuben died there in 1839. That left Almira head of household in 1840 to manage the farm with three boys under ten and two girls ten to fourteen. When Reuben's estate was settled his real estate was appraised at \$912.00 and his personal estate at \$1,494.34. @2159 In addition, his children owned a few parcels of land in their own right. The court did not clear this property for sale until 1851, but the family did sell it all. @2161

In 1842 Almira married recently widowed Nathan Hartwell of Littleton, MA, about 6 miles southwest of Westford. Nathan was fifty-six and Almira was forty-one. How many children of both composed the merged family is unknown. The marriage may not have worked out well as Almira does not appear on the 1850 census living with Nathan and at least one of her children had opted to live with relatives. Nathan died in 1853 age sixty-six leaving Almira a widow again. @682

From 1852 - 1855, Almira's two younger boys attended Kimball Union Academy, a private boarding school in Meriden, New Hampshire. Both boys went on to Yale College spending one or two years there. After college, but before the Civil War they worked as clerks. During the war they both served, Charles Henry Foster in the U.S. Army Subsistence Department and Lyman Beecher Foster in the 2nd regiment of the Illinois Light Artillery. After the war, both went to Florida to work in The Freedman's Bureau and then in various Florida State offices including the Florida Supreme Court. Charles was also an orange grower and Lyman a publisher.

Almira's three other children lived non farming lives as well. Julia Ann, the oldest married a house carpenter and lived in Worcester, MA. Reuben, the oldest son, moved to Princeton, in mid state Illinois very near to today's Interstate 80 where he became a book seller and stationer. Daughter Lucretia attended the then all female Mount Holyoke College in Fitchburg, MA, from 1846 to 1849 when she graduated. She then accepted a teaching position at the Fayetteville, Arkansas Female Academy, an all girls high school founded by Sophia Sawyer, an early frontier Methodist missionary. @2164 Lucretia married in 1856 William A. Jackson Smith, a teacher in Fayetteville. He died from consumption in 1857 and Lucretia died in 1863 in Fayetteville.

In 1860 Almira lived with son Reuben Bingham Foster in Princeton, Bureau, IL and was recorded as Almira Foster. Reuben remained in Princeton as a book seller and stationer, but Almira returned to Massachusetts where, as Elmira F. Hartwell, she lived in Fitchburg, Worcester County, alone, and was recorded as keeping house. Whether that was for herself or as employment, the census did not specify. However, one of the other families in the dwelling she shared was that of William Greenwood, born England, and wife Lucy/Lucie/Lucia. By 1880 Almira, now recorded as Alvina Hartwell lived as a boarder with the Greenwoods. Almira was then in her late seventies.

Almira died three years later in 1883, not in Massachusetts, but in Antrim, Hillsborough County, New Hampshire.

Details of Lucy's life are hard to figure out. We don't have proof of her marriage date and we have more children than we can fit into her life between the births of the children that we can document. We do know that she married George King and they lived in Brighton, Monroe County, New York. George claimed to have arrived in Western New York from Alford, Massachusetts in 1792 when he would have been about six years old. A Gideon King who lived in Alford in 1790, but in Bloomfield, Ontario County, New York in 1800 could have been his father. We can document a George King being an overseer of the roads on Methodist Hill in Henrietta, Monroe County, New York from 1815 to 1818. We can also document a George King who bought 2 lots in Monroe County in 1822, one in Henrietta and one in Brighton. 2177 Lucy and George would have been married by then.

Lucy would have left Lempster, New Hampshire with her brothers after their father, Vine, died in 1813. They settled in Genesee County NY about 1814. Later, in 1821 Monroe County was formed from parts of Genesee and Ontario counties. Lucy and George would have had ample opportunity to meet. Their oldest child was undoubtedly Vine B. born in 1819 and died two days after his mother in 1850. From 1819 until 1831 Lucy was busy raising children and George was busy farming.

Lucy died in 1850 and is buried in Mount Hope Cemetery, Rochester, New York. George died in 1859. He named George W. and Albert H. executors and specifically disinherited any children of his deceased daughter Clarissa Fuller. His daughter-in-law, wife of Vine, received the house across the street from his which was to go eventually to his grandson, Oscar Henry, Vine's son. The rest of the estate was to be divided among his living children as if he had died intestate. 1462

Phebe married farmer Asa Baker. They lived on the same farm in Henrietta their married life of forty-eight years. Their first child, Vine, died at five months, but they had 7 more sons who lived to maturity. Asa died intestate age 70 leaving a very small estate. Phebe remained in Henrietta living with son George and his wife Frances on a farm valued at only \$1,500. More research needs to be done on his and Phebe's life including land records and sons.

William was fourteen and living at home in Lempster, NH when his father died in 1813. William followed his brothers to Western New York. He first worked as a carpenter in Avon, Livingston Co. He then moved to the town of Perry where he married Elizabeth Roe of Perry. He and Elizabeth had two children before she died in 1827. He married second in 1828 and moved to Warsaw, Genesee Co. in 1830. There, he became an inn keeper. 115 He lived in Warsaw into the 1840s, but during the late 40s he managed inns in North Danville, Pike, Portageville, and Buffalo, NY. 150 Returning to Warsaw in 1850 he opened his own hotel which he named The Bingham House. William's children William, Lucien, Huldah, and Marietta were at home and the hotel had 25 residents on the day the 1850 census taker came. 92 He operated Bingham House until he retired 1 January, 1866. Betsey and he then moved into their first single family dwelling, later owned by their daughter Marietta Bingham Older.

Often referred to as "Colonel," William was active in community affairs from 1826 when he was commissioned second lieutenant in the 7th regiment, 4th brigade of artillery, presumably militia. In 1831 he was commissioned Colonel. In 1832 he served as Warsaw town collector, treasurer of Wyoming County in 1842 and 1843, and deputy marshal from 1856 to 1861. @2178, 2179

In his will, William provided for his living children and grandchildren as well as wife Betsey. @1462

Augustus and Sabra lived in Ulster Twp, Luzerne Co., PA in 1800 and had one daughter born that year. @92 They left PA before 1810, however, and moved to Livonia, Ontario Co., NY where Sabra's brother, Silas Bardwell, lived until he died of smallpox in 1811.

Augustus and Sabra remained in Livonia and Augustus, himself, served a little over three months, 9 Sep-17 Dec in the New York Militia in 1813 as a private in Lt. Cephas Beach's company of Col. Philetus Swift. @2188 According to the 1820 census, Augustus and Sabra still lived in Livonia in 1820. They had one male under 10, two males 10-15, 1 male 16-18, one male 45 and over; two females under 10, two females 16-25, one female 45 and over. These ages do not exactly mesh with birth dates and we do not have children names, but it is close. Where Augustus and Sabra lived in 1830, we are not sure, but perhaps in Allen, Allegany County, New York.

In the 1830s Augustus and Sabra moved to the area that was to become Jasper County, Indiana in 1838. The Land Act of 1820 made it possible to buy at least 80 acres for \$1.25 per acre with a down payment of \$100.00. They bought 160 acres of land through the LaPorte Land Office which opened in 1833 for the sale of land in northwestern Indiana. Son Augustus W. moved from Allegany County, NY to Jasper County at the same time. In 1840, the two Augustus were enumerated next to each other in an unincorporated area of Jasper County. Both made a living as distillers. Augustus and Sabra claimed to be in the 60-70 age bracket.

Augustus died in 1849 age 69 or 70. In 1850 Sabra lived with daughter Julia Ann Sparling in Marion Township, Jasper County. In 1852 Sabra applied for and received a warrant for 40 acres as a widow of a War of 1812 veteran. @2187

By then, the other children were married and settled in their careers and John and Tryphena were ready for a retirement adventure. They bought land near where Imlay City is today. Only children Truman and Louisa died in Michigan and were buried in the Webster Cemetery where Tryphena and John were buried. After John died Tryphena lived with daughter Sarah and her husband Frederick K. Bailey in Illinois.

Sarah was born in Litchfield County, Connecticut shortly after the Revolutionary War began and shortly before her father, Ozias, joined the Continental Army. After the war, when Sarah was seven or eight years old her family moved to Rutland County, VT where they were enumerated on the 1790 census. Apparently Sarah's mother, Sarah, was not happy with her army veteran husband, Ozias. They divorced in the early 1790s. Sarah, in her mid-teens, returned with her mother to Litchfield County, CT while her father went to Bradford and Luzerne Counties, PA.

Sarah was eighteen when she married Dr. Philo Guiteau. Philo's father, Ephriam, was the first practicing physician in the town of Norfolk. Philo followed in his footsteps. Sarah and Philo had five children. When the youngest was four years old, Philo died age 43 in 1809.

About five years later, Sarah married her cousin, Luman Pettibone, also a physician and originally a Norfolk resident, but then living in Stockholm, St. Lawrence County, NY. Sarah's mother, Sarah Phelps, and Luman's mother, Martha Phelps were sisters. Luman's first wife, Polly Kingsbury had died in 1813 leaving three children under eighteen. Sarah moved to Stockholm, Saint Lawrence, NY to live with him. Sarah and Luman had three children together, 1815, 1818, 1821. Luman died in 1823 age 56. Sarah was 46.

Sarah remained in Stockholm living with one stepson or another until her son Philo C. settled in Stockholm between 1840 and 1850. Philo had graduated from Oneida Institute in Whitesboro, NY in 1837/38 and Massachusetts Theological Seminary in Andover, MA in 1840. @2191, 2192 He was a Congregational clergyman. In 1850 he had a wife and two children and Sarah lived with them in Stockholm. Sarah's stepson Doras and his family lived next door. Sarah was 74.

By 1860 Sarah had moved to Waterbury, New Haven, CT where, at age 82, she was living with her daughter Myris G. Rockwell and her grandson P. Guiteau Rockwell, Physician and Surgeon. Sarah died later that year.

We have little direct evidence accurately dating the events of Roxanna's life. We do know, however, that she was called Roxa by her family and that Phelps and Servin in their 1899 two volume book titled *The Phelps Family of America...* knew her name to be "Roxanna". @2194 Most recently, creative Ancestry Tree makers have called her "Rosalea" or "Rosa Lena". In this bio sketch I favor the name Roxanna. A broken grave stone in the Old Gainesville Cemetery apparently uses the name Roxalena although it is difficult to read online. @682 In addition, I believe that the Roxie Cravath employed in 1823 to teach in the new school house in the village of Hermitage within the town of Wethersfield, Wyoming County, NY, where the Cravath's lived, was Roxanna's oldest daughter named for her mother. @2195 In other words, what we can document for Roxanna allows us to infer and calculate dates and other facts.

Roxanna was probably born in the town of Litchfield in the county of Litchfield in Connecticut. Her birth does not appear in the Barbour collection of Connecticut Vital Records, but her parents probably lived in Litchfield when she was born (See father Ozias' bio sketch). She would have moved to Rutland County, Vermont with her parents before 1790, then back to Litchfield County with her mother before 1795 when her parents divorced. By then, Roxanna was eighteen.

By 1798 she had met and married Ezekiel Cravatte (Cravath), next to the youngest child of Samuel Cravath of Harwinton, Litchfield County. Roxanna and Ezekiel's three oldest children, born 1799, 1802, 1804, usually claimed Connecticut for their birth state on the U.S. Census. The rest of their children, born 1805 to 1825?, always named New York as their birth state. From this information we can presume that Roxanna and Ezekiel moved to New York in 1804 or 1805, between the births of children three and four.

The family probably went first to Preble, then part of Tully, in Onondaga County. Ezekiel's older brother, James, had made the first settlement in Preble in 1796. James bought lot 68 for \$1.00 per acre and sold 300 of those acres to brothers Samuel and Robert who settled and remained in Preble the rest of their lives. In 1805 James sold the remaining acres to Garret Van Hoesen for \$12.50 per acre. @98

With his profit, James bought land the same year in Gainesville, part of Wethersfield Township then in Genesee County and settled there in 1806. @2196 In 1809 he bought several hundred more acres in Wethersfield. On lot 4 in the Hermitage section he built a log house "which was immediately occupied by his brother Ezekiel Cravath and his family". Thus it was that Roxanna, Ezekiel and children were the first residents of Wethersfield and the only residents of 1809. @2195

With the constant changing of town and county boundaries in western New York, research during this time can be confusing. For example, the 1810 U.S. Census has Ezekiel and family living in Sheldon, Genesee County and the 1820 U.S. Census has them in Gainesville, Genesee County where they were also in 1830. It is not clear whether they moved from one location to the other. Holland Land Company records do show, however, that Ezekiel made several land purchases in Lot 51 of Gainesville from 1812 through 1826. @454 Further research in the Holland Land Company and Wyoming County Land Records is needed.

We do not know if Ezekiel was only interested in Lot 51 in Gainesville or whether he later worked as a land agent for the Holland Land Company? I ask this question because after brother James died in 1826, Ezekiel might have become involved in land speculation. Some special draw took him to Evansburgh, now Conneaut Lake, Crawford County, PA where the Holland Company was trying to establish a foothold. Ezekiel had been in Evansburgh long enough before he died there in 1837 to have bought a lot reserved for the family burial ground. We have no evidence that Roxanna was with him in Pennsylvania. She is buried in New York in the Old Gainesville Cemetery. No one has found a grave for Ezekiel. However a will for Ezekiel Cravath was registered in Crawford County and the handwriting attested to as original by daughter Sarah. Son Samuel Prosper Cravath was one of three witnesses. He was to receive \$300 when he came of age, which coincidentally was 1837, and the right to buy out his brothers rights to Ezekiel's landed estate. The will did not include a description of what that might have been. The wife,

Roxanna, was not named in the original will dated 24 July 1836, but was named as Roxa in an undated codicil witnessed by only 1,10a.5two of the three original witnesses including son Samuel P. If Roxa survived Ezekiel she was to have her maintenance out of his estate during her lifetime to be appropriated by the will executors one of whom was son James Cravath who died in 1837 also. I can't help questioning the authenticity of this will for its unusual wording, for the lack of Roxanna's name and the names of the other living children, and for the fact that Samuel Prosper Cravath still lived in Evansburgh in 1840.

Roxanna was apparently left destitute. Since she does not appear in the 1850 census she may not have lived with any of her children after Ezekiel died. She was not mentioned in her father's will of 1843, either. She may have lived in the Wyoming County Poor House. Her grave is listed as "Poor Grave 2003 SE". Her death date on the grave marker posted on findagrave clearly reads 1855. Perhaps the typing on the web page that reads 1865 (in 2119) is a typo?

We have no exact birth date for Amanda, nor do we know who her father actually was. Her parents divorced between 1790 and 1795 and she was not mentioned in Ozias's will as sisters Tryphena and Sarah were. If she was at least 18 when she married Philo Spaulding in 1808, Amanda would have been born about 1790.

She, Philo and their three children, Augustus, Paulina and Moses left Connecticut in 1812 headed for Ohio. Philo's brother, David, and his family were with them, all traveling by oxen drawn wagons. When the party reached New York, authorities there encouraged them to stop until the frontier was cleared of Indian troubles. The men continued on foot to Ellsworth, OH and prepared a log house for their families. The following winter with sled runners for the wagons both families traveled on to Ellsworth, Ohio. @2203

Two more children were born in Ellsworth, Jerusha in 1813 and Amos in 1815. I doubt that Amanda and Philo had other children as some writers have named. @241 In the first place there are no records for them and in the second place the obituary for Moses clearly states "With the passing of Moses and Jerusha [she died on the same day], the history of the Philo Spaulding family closes". @2203

The source for the incorrect information about Mary is the Huntington Genealogy. @120 TAB copied from the Huntington Genealogy, also, and in addition to guessing about her death, picked up the incorrect middle name of Shattuck. We originally used TAB as our source, but are now correcting that error and Mary's middle name, also. Mary's middle name was Sophia as indicated in the newspaper record of her death and copied in Hale. @2204

The Huntington Genealogy also claims that Joel did not remarry for ten years. On July 1, 1813 he married Laura Cheney, perhaps a daughter of Lemuel T. Cheney who lived in Manlius in 1810. Joel and Laura named their first child Mary Sophia. She was born in 1814 and died in 1826. They had five more children.

Joel and Laura lived in Manlius, Onondaga County. The 1810 census adds confusion because it claims people living with Joel that we can't account for. His household consisted of four. He was the male 26-44, being 38 in 1810. But who was the female 45 and over born in 1765 or before and who were the boys, one under 10 and one 10-15?

Edwin Howe was a harness maker. In 1850 he lived with his sister and brother-in-law in Athens, Bradford Co PA. @92 While there he met and married Betsey Grey of Broome County, NY. After they married, they lived in Edwin's home town of New Milford for a few years. Finding it difficult to make a living they decided to look for work elsewhere. They made their way to Tennessee where, in 1860 he, wife B J and 5 year old son C F lived in Turnersville in the Western Division of Robertson County. His occupation was mechanic. Apparently that work was not to their satisfaction for in 1862 they were in Augusta, Georgia where his daughter Reata Augusta was born.

Living in the South during the Civil War Edwin probably found plenty of work as a harness maker. He could not, however, avoid the Confederate Army. On August 15, 1863, age 33 he was on the muster roll of Captain Hatch's Company mandated by law for a six month term. We next find him recorded as having enlisted on Feb 29, 1864 as a Private in Company D, 1st Regiment of Local Troops for the period of the war. The muster roll for March and April shows he was absent with leave. In May and June, however, he was recorded as present. @2222

After the Civil War was over, Edwin, Betsey, Charles and Augusta remained in Georgia where another daughter was born in 1868. They then returned north for in 1870 he and his family of three children lived in Binghamton, Betsey's home town and where Edwin was working as a harness maker. Four years later Edwin was dead, only forty-four years old.

Betsey did not remarry until 1885. To support herself and children she made vests. Joseph Cook, her second husband was about her same age and he was a grocer. In 1892, Edwin and Betsey's daughter Belle, and nephews Edwin and William D. lived with them in Binghamton. @2223 Betsey died in 1906, but Joseph remained with her children, altho by 1910 Mary Belle had become head of household. Joseph died in 1913.

Benjamin did not follow the rest of his family from Lyme, NH to Greene, NY. Instead he headed to Boston, MA There he met and married Mary Shepard in Roxbury in 1823 when he was thirty years old. They lived in Roxbury and had three children, a son and two daughters Both of the girls died in Roxbury when they were young. Benjamin then apparently moved to West Newton, Middlesex County where another daughter was born and where Benjamin and his family were enumerated on the 1840 and 1850 U.S. censuses. @150, @2037 Benjamin was a farmer. On the 1855 Massachusetts State census under Benjamin P. Bingham his age was 62, wife Mary was 60, daughter Mary Elizabeth was 19. Benjamin's occupation was farmer and his birth place was New Hampshire. @2036 Benjamin died 15 August 1859 of inflammation of the bowels. Benjamin's age was given as 66. Daughter Mary Elizabeth died in 1863 at West Newton. [Editor's note: Benjamin's middle initial is seldom used in records, but it sometimes appears as A, J, or P.]

Reata Augusta went by the name of Augusta. She was born in Georgia, but grew up in Binghamton, Broome, NY. She married first when she was thirty-four years old, John Edward McDonald. The marriage took place in London, England. McDonald was born in New York, the first child of Edward and Julia McDonald who had immigrated from Ireland. We do not know what Augusta did for a living before she married, nor do we know how they happened to marry in London, England.

After ten years of marriage, John and twenty-two other Americans were killed when the express train traveling at excessive speed taking them from their ship, the New York, to London, derailed on a curve near Salisbury Station in Wiltshire, England. @2218 Fortunately, for Augusta, also on the train, she was not killed.

In 1908 Augusta married second, Charles Louis Brodt. He had immigrated in 1852, age two years, from Alsace-Lorraine with his parents and naturalized in 1885. @ED, 682 He lived in New York City for most of his life. He began work as a bookkeeper and went on to become a liquor dealer and broker. He traveled to Europe frequently and he owned property in several places. In 1912 he bought and renovated the historic house "Maplewood" near what is now Tyson's Corner, Fairfax County, VA. Augusta must have had quite an interest in this project especially since the house was near Dunn Loring where her nephews lived. It also explains how she came to die in Fairfax County after Charles Brodt died and it may explain why her cause of death was secondary to chronic bronchitis. See her will at @2090 and @2128.

Mother Betsy died in 1906 and William married in 1905 and 1906 and moved out leaving stepfather Joseph, nephew Edwin, and one boarder in 1910. After Joseph died in 1913 Mary rented to two roomers, one a retoucher of photos in a photo studio as Mary had once been. Between 1915 and 1920 she sold the house and rented a flat or apartment at 99 Oak Street, a building still occupied in 2019. A woman recorded as a cousin and who also gave her occupation as a retoucher of photos lived with her. No occupation was given for Mary. By 1925 the cousin moved out and Edwin J. had returned after his wife died in 1923. Mary, at age 50, gave her occupation as housework. By 1930, still renting at 99 Oak Street, Mary's household included Edwin and Myrtle the maid, as it did also in 1940. Mary certainly had enough money and was well enough to go to Bermuda in 1926 and, in 1930, to sail to England and back. Her return trip from England was aboard the Duchess of Bedford sailing from Liverpool to Quebec the last half of July. @2225, 2226 Mary died while Edwin was still living with her in 1947, age 78.

Ralph was just twenty-one years old when he married Olive "Anna" Stout in 1888. Anna was nineteen. They lived in Anamosa, Jones County, Iowa. By 1895 Ralph with wife and three sons had moved to Clinton, Clinton County probably at the same time as his father, mother and siblings moved to Clinton as they lived next door to each other. Ralph's wife, Anna, died in 1897 and by 1898 he had remarried, but his sons by Anna Stout did not come with him.

With his second wife, Maud Rickoff, Ralph had eight more children between 1899 and 1918. Ralph managed to support his large family by working as a laborer at several different jobs. In 1901 he worked at Peterson & Bell and lived at 1011 Comanche Ave, Clinton, IA @620 But in 1910 he was a teamster working a wood wagon. Ralph still reported his occupation as laborer in 1920. Oldest child, Edith, who would have been twenty was not at home, but all of the other children were. @428

Ralph appears to have died in 1923. Although he is not listed among the several family members in the Springdale Cemetery, he may still be buried there. The 1929 Clinton City Directory shows Maud, Helen R. and Marie [misspelled] living together at either 812 or 912 12th Ave S. @624 In 1930 widow Maud is listed as head of family and daughter Helen R. and one boarder live with her. @655 Child Arthur is the Arthur, age 13 in 1930 both parents born Iowa listed as a Pupil or an Inmate at St. Vincent Home (Orphanage), Davenport, IA. @655 Older brother, Henry, was also given to the Orphanage. He died there in 1923, age six so we know that the two youngest children had been committed before or when their father died as Maud could not care for them. Maude died in November 1930.

After his mother and stepfather died, when he was single he lived with his aunt Mary. When married, he lived with his wife in their own home. All of his working life, he worked for only one employer, Security Mutual Insurance Company, in various capacities such as auditor, clerk and assistant cashier. His first wife died age forty-two in 1923. He did not marry again until 1950, after his Aunt Mary died. His second wife outlived him by eleven years.

Their only child, Reata Mary Bingham, was born on July 19, 1907 at their home at 614 West 136th Street in Manhattan. The 1910 census records that William and Flora lived in Newark, New Jersey at 908 Lake Street where William's occupation was draughtsman in the mechanical industry. After service in the first world war, William returned to Newark. The 1930 census records that William owned a shop that sold radios. In the early 1930s, William and Flora relocated to San Diego, California where their daughter Reata Bingham Duncan and her family were living. After daughter Reata and family left San Diego in July 1944, William and Flora moved permanently into the Duncan home at 8016 El Capitan in La Mesa, California. At the time of his death in January 1953, William was a member of La Mesa Masonic Lodge 407, a member and past Commander of La Mesa American Legion Post 282, and was employed as the chief building inspector for La Mesa. ²²²⁹

"Frank" was christened as Herbert E. Bingham., but he went by the name Frank. When 21 he married Dott Jay, age 18, in Des Moines, IA, 24 Dec 1905. They lived with her parents at 1532 E. Walnut. Dot's father worked for the City of Des Moines. ¹³⁵⁸

Frank and Dot's first child, John Ralph, was born in Des Moines in 1907. Frank worked as a street car machinist. ¹⁹³⁶ In 1909 they had a second child, a girl named Wilma Darlene, and on 3 Nov 1915 they had a third child, Ethel Caroline. but the marriage was not compatible. Dot remained with her parents, but Frank moved next door.

¹⁹³⁷ They divorced about 1916.

Frank moved to Omaha, Nebraska where on 5 June 1917 he filled out his World War I draft registration card claiming that he was married and had three children. Both of those statements are correct, but the three children were not with him and the woman he was married to was not their mother. His three children with Dot had remained with her while Frank had remarried in Omaha, Mabel Johnson. We do not have a record of the marriage, but the 1920 census tells us that Mabel was born in Nebraska, but both parents were born in Sweden. Mabel and Frank did have a child, but not until 17 September 1917. That means Frank and Mabel were probably married in 1916 or very early 1917. The child's name was Frank E. Bingham, Jr.

When Dot married second, Fred Lewis McVey, she took her two girls by Frank with her to Missouri, but John Ralph, her oldest child by Frank remained in Des Moines with her parents. ¹³⁵⁸ Dot's marriage to Fred McVey (also recorded as McVay) was after 5 June 1917 as Fred claimed to be single on that day when he filled out his World War I draft card. Dot had one child with Fred, Fred Jr., in 1921 after they had returned to Des Moines. Dot died in Des Moines fairly young at age 59 in 1948.

Frank and Mabel lived in Omaha until he retired. In 1920 he worked for Guy L. Smith Company, an auto dealership, as a foreman. ¹³⁵⁸ U.S. Census records for 1930 show Frank owning his own auto shop and in 1940 as a shop superintendent in a machine shop. More specifically, Frank used his full name on his 1942 WW II draft registration card: Frank Herbert Ellsworth Bingham, but signed as Frank E. Bingham Sr. "Mable" Bingham was his wife and he worked for Paxton-Mitchell Co. Paxton-Mitchell made the original under bridge "Snooper" truck. Frank became plant superintendent for Paxton Diesel Engineering.

When Frank retired after WW II, he and Mabel moved to Los Angeles, California. where son Frank E, Jr. had moved about 1948. ¹⁰²⁴ Frank Sr. died in 1955 under the name Frank Ellsworth Bingham, mother's maiden name Stout, birth date 19 Apr 1889, birth place Tennessee. ¹¹⁷⁴.

Mabel remarried 6 Nov 1958, Burton Langley, in CA. The California Marriage Index, 1949-1959. Ancestry.com lists the marriage on succeeding lines, one with Mabel's married name Bingham and one with Mabel's maiden name, Johnson.

Burton Langley had been a TEC5 in the US Army during both WW I & WW II. He died in 1982, age 87. We have not found a death record for Mabel.

Records for Harry, who did not have a middle name, and records for his brother Herbert Ellsworth (who called himself "Frank") are intertwined online. Some researchers have become confused enough to call Herbert Ellsworth "Harry" which is incorrect. Others have become confused by an H.E. Bingham marrying a Gertrude Harris in 1916. which seems to belong to Herbert Ellsworth, but it does not. Following is a discussion of the records that seem to belong to this Harry.

The Iowa State Census for 1895 shows Harry, age 4, living at home in Anamosa with parents Ralph and Anna. The next year, in 1896, for some undetermined reason, Harry was committed to the Iowa Children's Home Society before his mother, Olive Anna Stout, died in 1897. @2250 A death certificate for Olive Anna giving a cause of death might explain the situation. When Harry's father remarried in 1898 he did not bring his three sons by Anna Stout with him. Where the boys lived as children needs to be determined.

The U.S. Census tells us that Harry lived with the James Johnson family in Four Mile, Polk County, Iowa in 1910 and worked for the Johnsons as a farm laborer. The Iowa State Census for 1915 shows Harry living in Oelwein, Fayette County, Iowa and working as a fireman.

On 3 July 1916, using initials the initials, H.E., Harry married Gertrude Harris. @1939 In 1920, under the name Harry E Bingham, age 29 he lived with Gertrude, age 23, in Burlington Ward 4, Des Moines, IA working as an automobile mechanic.

In 1930 Harry and Gertrude lived in Chicago, Cook, ILL Harry's age was recorded as 39, Gertrude's age as 32. Harry was born in Iowa. His age at first marriage was recorded as 26, Gertrude's age as 19. Harry's occupation was Stationary Engineer in the Baking Industry. He rented and had a radio.

In 1940 Harry still lived in Chicago, but Gertrude did not live with him. Instead he was a married roomer, age 50, working now as a Stationary Engineer in Chemical Manufacturing.

Harry's 1942 Draft Registration Card records Miss Gertrude Harris of Burlington, Iowa as the person who will always know his address. Harry worked for Mr. L.A. Perez in the maintenance department and lived on Dorchester Ave in Chicago. From 1942 until 1965 we do not find any certain records for Harry.

It is not clear if Gertrude married second an Earl Benjamin or if she retained her maiden name of Harris, or both.

However, in 1965 we can positively identify Harry in the Montana Marriage Records 1943-1986 when he needed to give his parents' names for his marriage certificate to Loretta C. Nelson. He was 75 and she was 62. He lived in Billings and she lived in Miles City. This was marriage two for each of them. Two years after the marriage Loretta divorced him claiming "extreme cruelty". On the divorce record Harry claimed that this had been his 3rd marriage - and that he was a rancher. Loretta was a hotel maid.

How long Harry lived in Montana before 1965 we do not know, but he did live there from 1965 until his death in Billings 9 Aug 1981 age 90 at the Yellowstone County Nursing Home. On his death certificate his usual occupation was given as electrician. This information should help other researchers untwine records for him from records for his brother "Frank" Herbert Ellsworth Bingham. Harry had no middle name. Herbert gave himself the first name of "Frank". See his bio sketch.

Clifton Augustus Bingham was the first son of Edward Augustus and Augusta Rogers who were both educators. Clifton was born in Constableville, New York Dec. 22, 1907 and later moved to Spencer, New York, which was Edward's original home. Clifton was the valedictorian of his high school class of 1925 and an honor student in his class of 1929 at Colgate University at Hamilton, New York. He majored in Chemistry and minored in language, mastering five languages. He got a job with Bethlehem Steel Company in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania immediately after graduation in June of 1929, but it ended in October of 1929 when the company laid off many of the college grads they had hired because of the October stock market crash. He then was employed in the heat treating department of J. H. Williams Forging Company in the suburb of Buffalo, New York. Later, we know that he was working in 1936 at the age of 30 for the Babcock Poultry Farm in Ithaca, New York. Clifton then was employed as a milk tester in Tioga County traveling from farm to farm testing both the morning and evening milk samples and staying overnight with the farm family. This is where he met Annora Elizabeth McNeil who lived on her father's farm in Lounsberry, New York.

When WW2 broke out and he enlisted in the army Signal corps and went for training camp at Monmouth, New Jersey. Upon completing training, Clifton was sent to North Africa and was in a group that was chasing German General Rommel. After serving 11 months in North Africa, he was sent back due to health disability issues in 1944 and received treatment at the Veteran's Hospital in Canandaigua, New York. He received an Honorable Discharge on Dec. 1944. Clifton and Annora (Liz) were married in 1945 and purchased a farm in West Candor, New York. In September of 1950 shortly after the Korean Conflict started, Clifton took his own life fearing his return to active duty. @2088

Reata ,or Rea for short, Mary and her two sons had the distinction of living in Honolulu when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. They were there because Rea had taken on the job of officer's wife when she married a 1923 graduate of Annapolis, Marion Joseph Duncan. Fortunately, the ship on which Duncan was working, the USS Antares, a cargo ship captained by Lawrence C. Grannis, was standing off the entrance to Pearl Harbor when the Japanese struck. Recently arrived from Canton, China towing a 510 ton steel barge , the Antares was waiting for tugboat support. Later in the morning, after passing the barge to a tug, the Antares docked in Honolulu harbor, damaged, but no casualties. More information about the USS Antares is online. Marion Duncan remained with the ship until May 1943 when she arrived in San Francisco. While Marion was sailing around the South Pacific, Rea and the boys went to La Mesa, California where they had lived and where her parents were living.

Rea and Marion had started married life in Montana where for four years from 1925 to 1929 Marion had been assigned to the Civilian Conservation Corp under Army command. When his tour of duty was over, he resigned active duty, and took his commission in the Navy Reserve. He and Rea moved to Tacoma, Washington where they rented a house and Marion tried to earn a living selling bonds. Their first child, William, was born in Tacoma in February, 1930. That venture not paying well, they moved to La Mesa, California where their second child, McAllister was born in 1932.

Called back to active duty when WW II in Europe began to attract American attention, Marion was again assigned to the US Army and sent to American Lake VA Hospital in south Tacoma, Washington. Presumably, he was relieving an army officer for other duty. The family rented a place to live in Tillicum. They were not there long before the Navy found a position for Marion in Honolulu.

In 1943 Marion was relieved of ship duty and assigned to the Office of Naval Operations in Washington, DC. Rea and the boys joined him in DC. After two years in DC, and WWII was over, Marion was sent to Trinidad as Chief Staff Officer in the South Caribbean. As an officer's wife Rea went with Marion to Trinidad while their sons went to two different boarding schools in the U.S. After two years in Trinidad, Marion and Rea went to Naval Base New York for their last three years in the Navy. Marion retired in 1950. He and Rea settled down in his home county of Lincoln, Missouri where they farmed for sixteen years. In 1966 they moved to a high rise apartment on the river front in downtown St Louis. After Marion died in 1986, Rea moved to a Webster Groves independent living retirement center where she later died.

Royson, or Roy, lived with his divorced and remarried mother until he was over 21 years old. Thus, in 1900 he lived in Dublin, Cheshire County, NH while his father lived near Philadelphia. In 1902, age 23, he married Lilly Bell Messenger in Rockingham, Windham County, VT. In formal records Lilly was sometimes Lillie, or Lily and sometimes Lillian. Roy and Lilly had two children, Channing Messenger Bingham born 1903 in Vermont and Florence M. Bingham born 1905 in Massachusetts. Roy and Lilly's marriage did not last long. They were divorced by 1908 when Lilly, recorded as Lillian, married second, Alfred L. Billings. Alfred was a farmer. His land lay between Pelham and Ashfield, Franklin County, MA. Roy's children Channing and Florence grew up with Alfred Billings as their father and took the Billings surname. To research Channing and Florence researchers must use Billings as their surname.

To research their mother, Royson's first wife, now Lillian Billings, is another complicated situation. She remained married to Alfred Billings until 1927 when he died.®682 Later in the same year, 1927, the Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records shows a "Lillie (Messenger) Billings" of Ashfield marrying George W. Nichols on November 12, 1927. Nichols residence was Savoy when he married. He had been born in Lawrence. He was a farmer P.M. and she was a nurse. She had been born in Tupperville, Nove Scotia.®2050 The 1930 census shows Lilly, a trained nurse, and George W. Nichols, a fuel salesman, living in East Hartford, CT with his two daughters. If this information on generally accepted documents is correct, then why did the 1940 census responder for Channing Billings's household report a George Walker as his step father and someone else tell the newspaper that Channing's step-father, Geore Walker, was returning to Haverill, MA in 1942 to live with his own son? The answer does not come from a grave marker. Lilly's name as Lilly Messenger his wife, appears on Alfred Billings's gravestone.®682 Nor does the answer come from a name since the W. in George W. Nichols stands for Wesley not Walker. Lilly died in 1939 so she does not appear on the 1940 U.S. Census.

After his divorce, Roy was still single in 1910. He lived in West Springfield, Hampden County about 40 miles from Ashfield, with sister Grace M. and brother-in-law Harlon J. Desoe. The next year, in 1911 Roy married near Pittsfield, Trenea Sidney McPherson. She was 28, he was 32. She was from Waltham; he gave his occupation as R.R. Clerk. Both claimed it was their first marriage!®2045 They lived in Massachusetts where their first three children were born. The family then moved to Connecticut where Roy worked as an insurance agent and their 4th child was born in 1916. From then until 1925 they lived back and forth between Connecticut and Massachusetts as both city directories and the birth places of their children reveal. The World War I Connecticut Military Census describes Royson as being 5'5" tall and weighing 160 lbs. at age 38. He had five dependents, he could ride a horse and handle a team, but he could not drive an automobile and had no experience with machinery. No wonder he was selling insurance.®1998

After a few years in Springfield, MA, at least 1920 and 1921 the family began to look beyond Connecticut and Massachusetts. In 1925 they lived on Long Island, in Brookhaven, Suffolk County. Royson was a billing clerk and their family was complete with eight children.®1999 However, the West apparently offered more promise. They moved to Kansas City, Missouri before 1930. Ruth had already left home, but the six youngest children were at home in their rented house with no radio. Roy still sold life insurance.®1997 The insurance business must have fizzled out in the depression for in 1940 Royson age 61 was a minister! Ray, Harold, Alta May, Paul and Pearl were still at home. Even the ministry did not provide sufficient income for the family. In 1942 Roy was working for the WPA.®1983 He died three years later.

In 1900 Mabel was a 19 year old "servant" or farm helper living with Cyrus and Amelia Church, 73 and 62 respectively, in Walpole, Cheshire, NH. The census informant gave her birth date and place as Aug 1880 in Illinois.®2075 Her Massachusetts marriage record only states her age as 33 on June 22, 1914. This would make her 34 in Aug 1914 and corroborate the Aug 1880 birth. It was Mabel's first marriage and Walter Edward Richardson's second. Walter's first marriage lasted only a short time and there were no children. Mabel lived in Springfield, MA, Walter lived in North Reading, north of Boston. Mabel was a laundress, Walter, a farmer. They married in Longmeadow, MA, south of Springfield.®1989

They settled in Springfield/West Springfield, MA where their three children were born. Walter had a variety of jobs. The 1930 census shows that he was a stock clerk in a pump factory. They rented their house and had no radio.

Mabel died in 1935 leaving children age 21, 19, and 14. They remained in their home. In 1940 children Walter and Pearl were still at home. Their father, Walter, died in 1944.

Their first child, Harlon Theodore, was born 9 months after their marriage. The family lived in West Springfield, Hampden, MA. Their third child, daughter Doris Ella, born 1918, died a year later, 1919. Although the family lived together in 1920, Grace and Harlon divorced before 1930. Grace became a practical nurse. Like his father, Ralph became a painter with enough experience by 1940 to call himself a decorator. Like his brother, his first marriage did not last long. Ralph was 22 and Ara Gertrude (sometimes called Ava Grace) 20 when they married in 1914 in Keene, NH. Their child, Frederick Smith, was born in January, 1915. Ralph's 1917 WWI Draft Registration card shows that he was married with one child, but by 1920 Ralph and Ara were divorced. He lived in Manchester, Hillsborough, NH with the Clarence E.

Harvey family, she had gone home to her parents. @1981 Son Frederick was not recorded living with either, but that may be a census error for in 1930 he lived with his mother and step-father under the surname Saunders.

Ralph married second in 1920 Gladys M. Stewart. She as a 19 year old needle worker in Manchester. He was a painter and paper hanger. Mary G., their child, was born in 1921 in Boston, MA. Channing was born a Bingham in 1903. His parents divorced a few years later, shortly after his sister was born in 1905. In 1908 his mother married Alfred Billings. Channing's surname remained Bingham on the 1910 U.S. census. He and sister Florence were recorded living with mother Lily M. Billings and step father Alfred L. Billings near Pelham, MA. His stepfather was a farmer. Channing and Florence both attended school. @2062

Sometime between 1910 and 1920 Channing switched from being a Bingham to a Billings. Although the 1920 U.S. Census does not show him living at home, in 1921 he was Channing Billings, living with Alfred L. Billings and Billings's son Roger D. Billings at 41 Beech St., Springfield, MA. Alfred was no longer a farmer, but now a machinist in a factory and Roger a mechanic. Channing, however was a salesman. @1358 The three lived together in 1922, also, but had moved to 73 Spring St. in Springfield.

@1358

Channing used the surname Billings the rest of his life. His Mason's 1924 membership card recorded his name as Billings. He then lived in Belchertown, Ashfield, MA and worked as a farmer supervisor. In 1925 as Channing Billings he worked as an orderly at the Veterans Hospital in Northampton. @1358 In 1930, age 26, as Channing Billings he lived and was a student at American International College in Springfield, MA. @2061 Still in operation in 2019, the college was founded in 1885 to provide foreign students, especially French Canadians, access to higher education. @2063 Channing completed three years of college there.

About 1935 Channing married as a Billings. His wife, Ella Handfield was an Ashfield, MA native, and had worked as a domestic maid in Northampton. In 1940 they lived in Ashfield with two sons Roy and Edward Billings. Certainly, naming his oldest son Roy indicates that Channing knew of his Bingham heritage. Channing worked as a salesman and he and Ella owned their home. Ella's widowed French Canadian father Adolphe Handfield also lived with them as did Ella's brother Henry Handfield, called nephew.

Another household member was a man named George Walker. He was recorded as step-father, but records do not support that claim. Channing's mothers' fourth husband was more likely George Wesley Nichols. A George A. Walker on the 1930 U.S. Census, then married to Beatrice, lived in Haverill, Essex County, MA. He had immigrated from New Brunswick in 1894 and become a naturalized citizen. His occupation was dairy farmer. An Ashfield note in the North Adams Transcript for 27 March 1942 tells us that he had made his home for some time with his wife's son, Channing Billings, but was now, in 1942, going to Haverill to live with his own son. See under 1.1.1a.4.1a.1.3.2.2.1. Royson Frank Bingham for more on Channing's mother Lilly Messinger.

Channing and Ella lived in Ashfield until 1948. He then resigned as master of his Grange because he was moving out of town. @2064 He had purchased the South Amherst canning plant equipment, but what he did with the equipment we do not know. @2065 In November he was elected master of the Deerfield Valley Pomona Grange. @2066

Channing and his family went to Florida in late 1950 or early 1951 to make their home, but had returned to Massachusetts by June 1951 apparently after changing their minds. @2067 They obviously changed their minds, again, for more than thirty years later Channing, as a Billings, died in Florida in 1985. Ella lived another 18 years. She had lived with son Edward in McCaysville, GA where she died 6 years after Edward.

Between the years 1922 and 1933 Frederick lived in Marlboro, Middlesex, MA with his mother and step-father, George Saunders, and went by the last name Saunders. @655 On his own at age 19 in 1934, Frederick resumed use of his birth surname, Bingham, and lived at 25 Bridge Street, Keene, Cheshire, New Hampshire. @1358 Not married in 1940, Frederick lived with grandparents Frank W. and Hattie E. Smith in Keene using the surname Bingham. Frank worked as a machinist in a machine shop. @2079 That may be where he injured his right index finger as his WWII Draft Registration Card filled out the same year recorded a jammed index finger on his right hand. @2080 That might explain why Frank did not serve in the military during World War Two.

Frank married in 1941, Margaret Alice Desilets. He was 26, she was 25. Their marriage certificate shows that he worked at the New England Screw Company (NESCO) and she was a clerk in a shoe store. Frank probably worked as a machinist for NESCO until the war was over. By 1947 he was driving a truck for Arthur Whitcomb Company concrete and building materials with several locations in New Hampshire. He seems to have been a truck driver throughout the 50s, but by 1961 was a manager. @1358 Son Fredrick S., Jr. was a student living at home. We know little about his life from then until his death in Florida in 1989.
