NOTE: George did not marry twice. Wife Amanda outlived him. The numbering of all of George's descendants should be changed from 1a. to 1.

George married and lived in Tioga Co NY instead of moving to Cortland Co with his parents and the rest of the family. Although he was born in CT, he had lived in Susquehanna Co, PA from the time he was eight or ten. After nine years in Tioga Co, 1831 - 1840, George and family moved to Newport Twp, Lake Co IL about 1840 and he was enumerated there on a U.S. census for the first time in 1850.®92: 20 By 1860, he had moved to Padua Twp, McLean Co IL.®83:269 During the Civil War, five of his six sons, all but his oldest, were in the army at the same time. After the war, son George and daughter Florence remained at home until after 1870.®643 Sons Roger and John J. lived in the next two dwellings. In 1880, after George's death, son Elbert C. still lived in Padua Twp. Widowed Amanda lived with Florence, now married, and cared for granddaughter, Laura, whose mother, wife of Charles, had died in 1877.®175

When Flavel was about 13 years old in 1794 he was apprenticed to Daniel Burnap, Silversmith of East Windsor, CT.®683 In 1801, Flavel had his horse shod in Walesville, Whitestown Twp, Oneida Co, NY.®402 His older brother, Stephen, lived in Walesville at the time. From 1802 to 1804, Flavel worked as a silversmith in Utica, NY.®683 Both Fanny and Flavel died of typhus in the summer of 1804.®534

Moore, the third child of Solomon Jr. and Sylvina Dickinson, was a scholar like his father. He grew up in Berkshire, Franklin Co VT and was about twenty years old when his parents migrated to Canada. Moore apparently did not go with them, but remained in VT. Within a few years he was studying for the ministry with the Rev. Benjamin Bosworth Smith, rector of St. Stephen's Church, Middlebury VT.®462

According to several reports, during his youth Moore had learned to study while leaning against a tall chair back, to help overcome chronic leg pain. © 298 The pain, according to his aunt Hannah Bingham Willoughby, had been caused by Moore's great physical strength. As a child, he liked to lift heavy objects with his arms outstretched to either side, but this habit had caused his lameness and pain. © 462 Although we will never know, Moore's lifting could have caused a ruptured disc, hence the leg pain. We do know that after suffering for twenty years, he insisted that the leg be amputated, and that the operation did not completely eliminate the pain. © 462; © 463: 78-82

After about three years of study, Moore was ordained deacon 23 Oct 1825 and assigned to Berkshire. © 299 In March, 1826, he took over Trinity Episcopal Church, Fairfield Twp, Franklin Co VT and by June had added Grace and Sheldon churches to his duties. He also married Ann Barber.

In 1827, Moore was ordained to the Episcopal Church priesthood and in 1828 he took over the congregations in Poultney, Vt and Hampton, NY and he and Ann settled in Hampton.®115:278 Between 1829 and 1839, he worked hard to build his congregations, but his annual reports show his constant frustration with losing parishoners to migration west. ®464: 49-50; 36, 40; 8465: 7-8, 13, 17 25

Ann died in 1835 fifteen days after their fourth child was born. She was buried in Hampton.

Moore married second, Lucy Barber about 1837 or 1838. She was seventeen years younger than Ann and up to twenty years younger than Moore. She and Moore had five children.

In 1839, Moore was named rector of Christ Church, Enosburgh, Franklin Co VT. He bought a 160 acre farm in Berkshire Township in 1840 and the family was enumerated there on the 1840 U.S. census.®150: 4; ®299 Moore resigned from Christ Church in 1845, sold the farm in 1846, and moved back to Hampton, Washington Co NY where the family was enumerated in 1850.®92: 232 Son Lewis, age fifteen, lived with the Horatio N. Barber family in Enosburgh, Franklin Co VT.®92: 178 Horatio Barber was probably Lewis's uncle. Moore served several churches in the area and occasionally in Rutland Co VT, also.

"Weary of a meagre and uncertain salary for support," Moore resigned as rector of Christ Church, Hampton in 1853 and moved alone to WI.®462 He literally worked himself to death trying to reduce his raw land to cultivation.®298 Lucy, a widow with several young children, married second in 1861, widower Martin Bartlett. Martin died 25 Dec 1879 age 78. From then until her death in 1888 at age 71 years, 9 months, 18 days,®59 Lucy [1880 census translated name as Lobil] lived with daughter Ann Eliza Stone and family in Jericho.®175 Lucy's grave marker in Jericho Center Cemetery reads: Mrs. Lucy Bingham; wife of Martin Bartlett and Rev. Moore Bingham, Age 72 years, 11 mos. ®682

Lorenzo was a Methodist minister. He went to Michigan before 1840 and was enumerated in Hearsly, Genesee Co that year.®150: 27 He probably married in MI as his first child was born there in 1842. Son Jacob's death record names mother as Sarah Hiller of New York®823. By 1850, Lorenzo lived in Flint, Genesee County along with his brothers, Orson and Samuel, and his mother, Polly. His children then were Arvilla, 8; Jacob, 6; David E., 4. ®92:173

In 1860 Lorenzo and family lived in Independence, Oakland, MI. Clarkston was their post office. Children were Jacob, 15; Edson, 13 (probably David E. of 1850); Alonzo, 10; John, 7; Ellen, 4. Daughter Arvilla is missing from the family and a search of the 1860 census for all Arvillas born and living in Michigan produces no possibilities. Lorenzo's occupation was farmer and the value of his real estate stated at \$1600.®83, Roll M653 556, p. 0, Image 313

In 1870, Lorenzo was farming in Burns, Shiawassee County, Michigan. Alonzo at age 26 was at home, as were John at 17 and Ellie at 15.®643, Roll M593 704, p. 251, Image 92

Lorenzo died of consumption the next year according to the Michigan death records. The record states that he died in Calhoun County, was born in Vermont and that he was a minister. One of the children must have filled out the form as they entered Lorenzo and Sarah for father and mother instead of the names of Lorenzo's father and mother.®787

John farmed in Mc Lean Co IL until after 1880 when he moved his family to Hand Co, Dakota Territory.®726 The entry of the Northern Pacific and Great Northern railroads into the territory by 1882 created a spurt in homestead grants which peaked in 1884 when over 11 million acres were granted to settlers. John J. patented 160 acres in section 17 Burdette Township on April 15, 1887, paying cash.®714 North and South Dakota were admitted to the Union as separate states in 1889. About 1896, John spent two years in Missouri, but returned to Hand County by 1900, when he lived in Gilbert, a very small town. At that time he was 66 and his wife was 57. His four youngest children: Walter 28, H. John 26, Ernest 22, Anna 19 were still at home.®706 In 1910, John, a widower, lived with youngest son, Ernest in York, Hand, SD.®428

Charles was twenty-six and married just two days when he enlisted as a private in Company D, 94th Illinois Infantry on 20 Aug 1862. He was promoted to full corporal and on 29 June 1865 mustered out and cited for Distinguished Service.®676 Brothers George and Elbert served in the same regiment. Two other brothers served in different regiments.

After the war, Charles, and family lived in Blue Mound Township, Mc Lean Co IL.®643 Wife Emily died in 1877 leaving Charles with two young children. His widowed mother and youngest sister, Florence, took three year old Laura to live with them.

Charles remarried before June 21, 1880 when his family was enumerated in Benton, Lake Co IL.®175 Caught up in the mid-1880s homesteading craze, Charles homesteaded 160 acres in Armenia, Juneau Co (SE 1/4 Twp 20), WI in 1884 and completed the requirements and received the patent in 1892.®510 They lived on the farm until after 1913 when, according to Lottie's obituary, they moved to Racine WI to live with son Homer. After Charles died in 1914, Lottie lived with Homer until she died in 1943.

During the Civil War, George served in the same 94th IL Infantry regiment as brother Charles.®676 George enlisted as a Private on 3 Aug 1862 in Company D. He mustered out 17 Jul 1865 in Galveston TX and was cited for Distinguished Service.®676

In 1870 he lived at home with his parents in Padua Twp, McLean Co, IL, but after he married in 1875, moved to Blue Mound Twp where he and his wife lived in 1880. They had no children.®694

Before 1893, they moved to Bennet, Nemaha Precinct [Township], Lancaster Co, NE, just a few miles east of Lincoln where George was enumerated on the 1893 list of Illinois Veterans living in Nebraska.®698 The town of Bennet was on the Midland Pacific Railroad line. George and his wife still lived in Bennet in 1900.®258 They managed to escape the 1910 census. By 1920 George's wife had died and he lived in Dos Palos, Merced County, CA with his widowed sister, Florence.®700

During the Civil War, Frank first served in Company K, 8th IL Infantry as a Private. He enlisted 18 April 1861 and mustered out July 25 [see Box 539, Extraction 7; Record 2216].®678 He then reenlisted on September 6, 1861 as a Sergeant in Company B, 66th IL US Infantry, was promoted to full Lt First Class, 30 April 1862, and mustered out 18 Oct 1864 - all from Bloomington IL.®676

Frank obviously returned home on leave during the war for he was married in 1863. His only child, a daughter, was born in 1867 in Illinois, but the family managed to escape the 1870 census. The next we know of Frank and family is in 1880 when they lived in St Louis, MO. On the day of the census, June 2, Martha claimed to be disabled due to nervous headache. Frank worked as an engineer in a mill.®175

In 1900, Frank and Martha lived in Fond Du Lac Ward 8, Fond Du Lac, WI. Frank worked as a stationery engineer and rented his house. ®258 We do not have a death date for Frank, but it is probable that wife Martha died before 1910 and that this is the Frank Bingham, b, NY, father b. CT, a widower age 70 living in Edwarsdsville, Madison, IL at Pfeiffer Hotel, 323 St Louis Street. ®428

Elbert served in Company D, 94th IL Volunteer Infantry, the same regiment as brothers Charles and George, during the Civil War. He enlisted 20 Aug 1862 and mustered out 29 Jun 1865 with a Distinguished Service award.®676 In 1870, with his name as Albert, he lived in Padua now Elsworth, McLean, IL with wife Mary, but no children yet.®643 In 1880 he still lived in Padua, but by now had two children, Harry E. and Eva. A third child was born in 1881. Daughter Eva was married in McLean County in 1895®633 so we have a record of Elbert being there, then, and again in 1910 when he was enumerated living in Dawson Township, McLean County.®428

Sarah married Quaker Ira P. Bedell. In 1880 they lived in Old Town, McLean, IL where Ira farmed. ®715 They belonged to the Clear Creek Monthly meeting in Benjaminwille, now Bentown and were enumerated in the 1880 census, but not thereafter. ®716

Apparently Roger enlisted in a Wisconsin regiment during the Civil War instead of a regiment being formed nearer his home in Padua, McLean County, IL. The records show he enlisted from Bloomington, WI on June 20, 1861 as Private in Company H, 6th Wisconsin Infantry. Roger was wounded at Gettysburg on July 1, 1863. On November 27, 1864, he transferred from Company H to Company F and he mustered out July 14, 1865.®676

After the war he married and lived in Padua with wife Calista [Corlista] and daughters May and Nellie ®643 Before 1875, they moved to Kansas where daughter Mina/Miria was born. So far we have not found a record of his death, but in 1880 Calista was head of household and living back in Old Town, McLean, IL.®175 She applied for a widow's pension.

In 1900 Calista [Calisty H.] was still head of household and living in Dawson, McLean, IL. With her was daughter Nellie E, 28, unmarried, Mark and Jennie E. Deverenex, and James Clingan, the last three boarders. In the 1910 census Calista was entered as Calixto, widowed, but male in gender! Nellie still lived with her mother and they still lived in Dawson Twp and ran a boarding house but had no boarders. \$\mathbb{8}428\$ Both could have died before 1920 as they do not seem to be on the 1920 census.

Ezra enlisted on August 30, 1862 at age nineteen as a Corporal in H Company 147th NY Infantry. He was captured at Gettysburg July 1, 1863, but paroled. On June 20, 1864, he was promoted to Full Sergeant and on 7 June 1865 he was mustered out giving him 2 years, 9 months, 7 days service.®676 For that service he qualified for care in the Nebraska Soldiers and Sailor's Home, Grand Island, Hall, NE. In 1890 he was enumerated there as a resident.®697 Wife Florinda applied for a invalid pension on July 15, 1889 and for a widow's pension on May 16, 1891. Brother George A. Bedell, husband of Florinda's sister, Miranda, was Ezra's guardian.®717

Sometime in the mid 1880s Ezra and family left Loraine, Henry County, IL where he was a farmer and enumerated on the 1880 census and moved to Nebraska. A Nebraska Tract Book search shows Ezra M. Bedell owning land in sec 30, Twp 13, R 38W [Reel 11 or 12]. Further research will reveal if he actually lived there. His wife, Florinda Bingham, and children need further research.

Miranda's husband, George, younger brother of Florinda's husband, Ezra, also fought in the Civil War, but did not enlist until 3 Sep 1864 when he was eighteen. He served as a private in Company F of 189th NY Infantry and was mustered out 14 Jul 1865.®697 He and Miranda were married after the war.

In 1880 they lived in Old Town, Mc Lean, IL with their two sons Roy G. and Byron. Edwin Flansburg, 20, also lived with the family.®718 Edwin was brother to Elisha, husband of sister Florence.

By 1890 the family had moved to Fairbury, Rock Creek, Jefferson, NE where the Nebraska State Gazeteer, Business Directory for 1890-1891 listed G A Bedell as a farmer.®719 The 1890 census Special Schedule of Surviving Soldiers, Sailors, and Marines, and Widows, etc also listed George A. Bedell in Rock Creek Precinct, NE. But soon George fell ill and on October 25, 1892 Miranda applied for an invalid pension.®717 George is not in the 1904 City Directory for Fairbury. He may have moved to Missouri by then for in 1910 he and Miranda lived in Kansas City Ward 15, Jackson, Missouri.®428

George died before 1919 when on June 6, Miranda applied for a widow's pension.®717 Miranda continued to live in Kansas City. She owned her home and lived alone as shown by both the 1920 and 1930 census. Son Roy G. remaind in Fairbury all of his life, but son Byron E. lived near Kansas City and in 1930 in Washington, Jackson, MO. Miranda died after her eightieth year.

Also living with them was Clara Graff, 15, servant, and Horace Bedell, 24.®175

Little is known about Florence's life between 1880 and 1910 when they lived in Lincoln Ward 4, Lancaster, NE age 56 and 58. Elisha was a carpenter. ® 699

The Flansburgs were Quakers from New York State. They moved to Padua Township, McLean County, IL between 1865 and 1870. In Padua they apparently belonged to the Benjaminville Monthly Meeting which began about 1867.®720

Elisha was a brother to Edwin Flansburg who lived with sister Miranda and George A. Bedell in 1880. Niece Laura, daughter of Charles Lee, also married a Flansburg.

By 1920, Elisha had died and Florence lived in Dos Palos, Merced, CA with brother George whose wife had also died.®700 In 1930 Florence lived alone, age 77, in Merced County, CA.. Brother George had died between 1922-25.®702

Wheelock lived in the Second Ward, City of Indianapolis, Marion Co IN in 1860.®83 He was a jeweler with property valued at \$1,000. His three year old daughter, Mary, and one year old son, George, were born in IN, so we may presume that he and wife, Sarah, had been in Indiana since at least 1857.®JEJ They had a servant named Eliza Fletcher, age 25, born in Indiana.®83

In 1870, son George was ten, a son, Joseph S. who turned out to be a daughter, Josie, was six years old, and a son, Wheelock P., was four months old. Their new domestic, John Dunlap, was from Ireland.®643

Still living in Indianapolis and working as a jeweler in 1880, Wheelock had a new wife. Sarah, the mother of his children, had died in 1876, perhaps in connection with their youngest daughter's birth. Five children were at home and Johanna Hogan, an Irish immigrant, was now their servant.®175

Wheelock's business located at 12 E Washington was named Bingham and Walk, Diamonds, Watches and Jewelry. His partner was Julius C. Walk.®734 Julius was the watchmaker. ®643 Hattie A. Bingham (widow Wheelock P) was listed in Wheelock's place in the city directory for 1890.®734

Anne Eliza and Isaac reported in 1910 four children born but only two living. Daughter Jannie/Jennie died age 3 and is buried in Jericho Center Cemetery with the rest of the family. Daughter Lillie needs to be found. Anne's mother, Lucy Barber Bingham Bartlett lived with the family in 1880. Isaac was a farmer.®175, ®428

Son Bingham H. Stone earned his MD degree and became director of the Bacteriology Laboratory of the Vermont State Board of Health and Professor of Bacteriology and Pathology at the University of Vermont.®747 He was also president of the Vermont Medical Association in 1912.®748 He died in 1921 and is buried in Jericho Center Cemetery.®682

After Anne's husband, Isaac, died in 1906, she lived with son Bingham H. Stone in Burlington ®428, ®648 But Bingham died in 1921 only 46 or 47 years old! Anne moved to Forest Grove, Oregon to live with daughter Susie and her husband Watson C. Lee.®655 Anne died in 1934 and is buried in Forest Grove, but she is commemorated on husband Isaac's head stone in Jericho Center Cemetery, Jericho, VT ®682

He enlisted as a Private on 7 Dec 1861 in Company A 1st Vermont Cavalry and was discharged on disability on 24 Dec 1862. \$\@8676\$ In 1870, he was a dry goods merchant in Jericho. \$\@8643\$

By 1880, when the census taker spelled his name "Wyram," Wareham claimed to be retired at age 42. Daughter Helen B. was enumerated as son Heber B. age 12. Jennie had had two more children, Mamie B., 9, and Cynthia, 7. All the children were at school.®175

Apparently Wareham was not actually retired for the 1882-83 Jericho Business Directory listed him as dealer in "dry goods, clothing, groceries, crockery, boots and shoes, fancy goods, notions, etc.," and proprietor of Pierce Hall.®745

It is probable that Wareham died in the mid 1880s when, going by the name Lucy, the record book of Calvary Episcopal Church, Underhill, Chittenden County shows Lucy was "received" on 29 June 1884.®JEJ

In 1900 and 1910 Lucy lived with daughter Cynthia, her husband Charles Jackson and their family in Jericho. \$\&258\$, \$\&258\$

The family had moved to Burlington by 1920 when Lucy was 76. But in 1930, Cynthia was living alone back in Jericho. Both her mother, Lucy, and her husband, Charles, had died between 1920 and 1930.®655

It is likely that Susan was born 1 Dec 1847 in Hampton, Washington County NY where her father spent most of his time as a minister. In 1860, after her father died, Susan lived with grandmother Lucy Barber in St Albans, Franklin Co VT.®83: 80

Susan married Orlando L. Bicknell in 1865 or 1867, probably in Wisconsin.®746, ®749 He was a Civil War veteran having served in the Nine Month Volunteers from Vermont in 1862.®749 He enlisted as a Private in Company C, 12th Vermont Infantry on 4 Oct 1862 and was promoted to Full Corporal 28 Aug 1863. He mustered out 14 Jul 1863 at Brattleboro VT.®676

According to the 1880 U. S. census where their surname was spelled "Bicknal", their first child, Josephene [sic], was born in Wisconsin. Their next child, Jennie or Jannie, was born in Vermont. Then Ellen, who soon died, was born in either WI or MN.®749 The rest of the children were born in Illinois. The Bicknell Family Genealogy claims they lived in Oak Park, but in 1880 the family lived in Cicero, Cook County and father Orlando worked as a "Book keeper."®175

By 1900 Susan and Orlando claimed to have been married 33 years. If so they were married about 1867, perhaps in Wisconsin. But, in 1900 they still lived in Cicero, Cook County, Illinois. Susan had had 7 children and in 1900 5 were living and 3 were at home: Jennie, 31, Orlando, 21, and Harold, 7.®258

Orlando died in 1906. In 1930, Susan, 82, lived with daughter Lucy and her husband John W. Alvord in Chicago. Susan's son Harold also lived with them. John W. Alvord was a civil engineer and Harold was a mining engineer. ®655

1910 are unknown. We do know that youngest child Hazel was born in Illinois in 1892 and that youngest son, Wareham B. lived in Spearfish, SD in 1900. He was unmarried, boarded and worked as a day laborer. ©258

We find the family in New Mexico in 1910. Father Nelson and son Wareham lived next door to each other in Clovis, Curry County. A daughter, Hazel, age 18, born IL lived with them. Nelson and Amelia had been married for 38 years and had had eight children with 6 surviving. 428 Nelson and Amelia were enumerated a second time in 1910 living in Floyd, Roosevelt County, NM. This time daughter Hazel had the surname "Galbraith." All other information for Hazel was the same. Next door to them in Floyd lived daughter Lillian and family. Lillian had lived in Kansas until after 1906 where her youngest child was born. 428

In 1912 Nelson secured a patent to his homestead claim of 154.40 acres in Roosevelt County, the NE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 and the NW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of section 30 in township 1 south of range 32 east of the New Mexico meridian ®742

Named as Wilson B. in 1920, children of two of his own children lived with him and Amelia: Lillian, the oldest daughter and her children Wesley, William, and Hazel and Fannie's children Virgil Yoder, Robert Yoder, and Juanita Yoder. Nelson raised cattle.®648

Henry enlisted in the army August 11, 1862. He was a Private in Company C, 18th Regiment, Connecticut Volunteer Infantry. On 15 June 1863, during the engagement at Winchester, VA, he was taken prisoner. He was detailed as a nurse for the Confederacy as they were on their way to Gettysburg. While working in the hospital, he contracted a mild case of smallpox and was sent to the Pest House, then paroled. He returned to his regiment serving in the campaigns in VA and MD. On March 14, 1864 he was commissioned Lieutenant 30th Regiment, Connecticut Volunteer Colored Troops and on January 27, 1865 he became a Lieutenant in the federalized 31st U.S. Colored Troops and sent to KY and Petersburg, VA. At the close of the war he was sent to the Mexican border where he served from May 1865 to November 7, 1865.®676, ®687

Henry returned to Lisbon and leased the Andrew Burnham homestead, but died of tetanus Aug 30, 1866.®687

Jacob was of the generation that fought in the Civil War. At the age of 18, on 2 November 1863 he went to Chester, Eaton, MI and enlisted as a Private in Company G, Eleventh Cavalry for three years. He mustered 7 November. Later he transferred to company A, Eighth Cavalry. Jacob's compiled service record needs to be studied to learn what he did in the Eighth Cavalry. Apparently he was home in Oakland County in March 1865 when he had the opportunity to enlist in the Tenth Cavalry when it was reorganized. He was assigned to Company K and joined the regiment at Lenoir, TN 28 June 1865. He was mustered out at Memphis, TN 11 November 1865.

In 1890, Jacob applied for an invalid pension on the basis of his service in the Tenth Michigan Cavalry. That application should be studied. Then, on 19 July 1922, two weeks after Jacob died, his widow, Priscilla, applied for a widow's pension.®541 This is curious because at no time did Priscilla appear on a census record with Jacob. In fact, in 1900 Jacob lived alone in the residence next to son Frank, but listed himself as married. In 1910 Jacob lived with his son, Frank, and was listed as a widower, married 40 years. In 1920, Jacob was still classed as a widower and he claimed no one else in his household. Jacob's marriage or marriages need further research.

Returning to Jacob's post war life, he was not at home in 1870 and probably had married about that time. Based on later census information, Jacob lived in Michigan in 1873 when his first child was born. One researcher claims that later the family moved from Michigan

to near Neilsville, Polk, MN right across the Red River of the North from Traill County, ND, but this has not been verified. Their next move was to Willow Vale Township 12, Bottineau County, ND where Jacob's name appeared as a resident on the newly completed federal township plat dated 1888, meaning that he was living there by then. His uncle Orson, brother of father Lorenzo, lived in township 26 @825

Jacob patented his tract in 1891. It was the 160 acres of the SW 1/4 of section 12 of township 160N range 75W in Bottineau County (directly south of the Manitoba - Saskatchewan border), ND by cash entry.®796 Three years later, in 1894, Jacob filed a Homestead claim for the NW 160 acres of section 25 in what is now Elysian Township, but then was called Mouse River School Township, Bottineau Co, ND. Son Frank filed for adjoining land. They both patented their 160 acre tracts in 1902.®797 See Frank's entry.

Father and son lived on adjoining properties in 1900. Jacob listed himself as Head and married but no wife's name was recorded.®799 In 1910 Jacob age 65 lived with son Frank and new wife Margaret in Elysian Twp, Bottineau Co ND.®801 He still owned land in sections 25 and 26 of Elysian Township.®565 He reported his marital status as widower who had been married 40 years.®801

Before he was 75, Jacob moved into his own home on Dewey Street between Second and Main in Omemee Vilage, Willow Valle Township. ®802 Again, he was recorded as Head and Widower.

In 1870, Alonzo lived with his parents in Burns, Shiawassee, MI. He married about 1874 and moved to Caledonia, Traill County, Dakota Territory, now ND, in the summer of 1879. He, his wife, and first child traveled by train from Saginaw, MI to Fargo and then by ox team to Caledonia. He settled in section 28, township 147, range 49. Later, Caledonia was divided and the northern part was named Bingham in honor of Alonzo. He was the first county commissioner of Traill County, a school director for many years, and very active in the Methodist church.

Five years after settling on his 160 acres, Alonzo received his patent for the tract, the NE 1/4 of section 28 in township 147N, Range 49W of the 5th principal meridian.®806 In 1897, Alonzo patented the 160 acres of additional land he was entitled to under the Timber Culture Act of 1873. That tract was the 160 acres directly south of his original tract.®807

The 1885 North Dakota territorial census included his family with the four children born to that time. 8808 By 1900, Alonzo's family was complete with eight children. Alonzo [named Alan in the census] and Olive had been married for 25 years. 8809 In 1910 the family still lived on the same farm in Caledonia Township, Traill County. Children Ben, Grace, Earl, and Florence B. were at home. 8811

Alonzo apparently died in 1912. We have yet to determine what Olive did between then and 1937 when she reportedly died.

Twenty years later, John and family still lived in Rush and his mother was still alive and living with them. His oldest daughter was 20 and his youngest daughter was 6. His one son was only 9 so John employed a 20 year old farm hand, Warren J. Walters. John owned his farm outright.®792

By 1910, John's mother had died and his children were grown and gone. Only he and Sarah were at home, but son Phillip lived in the next dwelling and now worked the family farm. At age 56, John reported that he did not work, yet had his own income.®793

John died in 1918 and in 1920 his widow Sarah lived with their son Philip in Rush.

Yale historian Hiram Bingham III rediscovered Machu Picchu in 1911. Now Peru wants Yale to return the artifacts that Hiram packed out. Supported by the National Geographic Society, Hiram returned to Machu Picchu in 1912 and 1915. Each time he left, he took hundreds of archaeological finds with the permission of then president Augusto Leguia. Many of the pieces that Peru wants returned were exhibited in a traveling exhibition in 2003. Yale claims that it has about 250 pieces of exhibitable quality, but no mummies, no gold objects, and only a few small silver pieces. Peru wants to know what happened to the 4,750 other artifacts. Yale's reply pointed out that its efforts have helped make Machu Picchu South America's best known archaeological site, attracting 500,000 visitors a

year. Hiram Bingham's books and articles about the Lost City of the Incas introduced Machu Picchu to the world. To read more, search the internet.

When John N. enlisted as a Private in Company G, 6th Wisconsin Infantry Regiment in 3 Jun 1861 he gave his residence as Beverly, Canada.®676 Company G was very active during the war and John was shot in the hip. For regiment details see American Civil War Regiments on Ancestry.com.®676 John was discharged 14 July 1865 and was credited with 4 years, 2 months and 2 days active service although the exact dates of his enlistment and discharge vary with the record.®761 On 16 April 1872, when he lived in Iowa, John filed for an invalid pension. His widow later claimed that he had a slight limp.®717

John's first four children were born in Iowa between 1866 and 1873, but we have not been able to identify the town or county name as the family does not appear in the 1870 federal census. John's fifth child, named Minnesota, was born in that state in 1875. His last three children were also born in Minnesota where the family lived in Guilford, Wabasha County in 1880 and 1885. His last child was born there in 1883. \$\@0.762, \@175, \@788\$

By 1890, the family had moved to Forman, Sargent, North Dakota where John was listed on the 1890 Veterans Schedule.®761 He had patented 160 acres in Sargent County under the Homestead Act. The patent, dated 10 September 1889, was for land located in section 7 of range 58 west of the 5th meridian in township 131 north.®772 Since the Homestead Act required five years of residency and cultivation prior to receiving a patent, John and family would have occupied their 160 acres about 1884.

The family moved again before 1900 to Bear Creek, Dickey, North Dakota, perhaps to be near oldest daughter May and her family who also lived in Bear Creek. John was 64, Frances was 59, and daughter Cora, the only child at home, was 20. John and Frances had been married 39 years, owned their on home, had had 8 children, and 7 were then living.®763

In 1910, John and Frances were enumerated in the town of Oakes, Ward 3, Dickey County, North Dakota. by then they had been married 48 years. Youngest son Arthur F., age 26, lived with them. John indicated that he had immigrated in 1887, so perhaps that is the year when he became a U. S. citizen. Frances had immigrated from Germany with her family in 1849 when she was 3 years old.®769

John must have died about 1916 for on 1 March 1917 Frances applied for a widow's pension.®717 Frances lived until after 1920. In that census year she lived alone in her own home in Oakes.®767

Alfred enlisted in the army when he was 19 years old. At the time he lived in Seneca, Michigan, but went to Port Huron to enlist as a Private on 11 October 1861. For details see American Civil War Regiments on Ancestry.com or elsewhere. Alfred mustered out 18 November 1864 at Detroit, Michigan.®676

In 1869 he filed for an invalid pension which was granted on April 2.®786 His Civil War record needs to be studied. Wife Elizabeth filed again as a widow on 2 May 1908, the year that Alfred died. ®786

Alfred married Elizabeth F. Collins about 1878. She had been born and raised in Millington, Tuscola County, Michigan and was fourteen years younger than he. By 1880, they had two young children and Alfred was farming in Millington. @172, Roll T755-6

Somehow, Alfred missed the 1890 Veteran's Census and in 1900 he was listed under the name Albert. They had had four children, two were living and one was Edna who at age 10 was at home @258, Roll T623 745, P. 12A, ED 123

Alfred died in 1908 when Elizabeth filed for a Civil War widow's pension. In 1910 she appeared on the census as Libby and lived in Millington with her sister and husband Henery and Ella Long.®428

But in 1900 Edward's wife went by the name of Ettie R. and the census taker gave her credit for having had four children with none living. To complicate matters, Edward and Ettie said that they had been married only four years. If that is true, Ettie was not Edward's first wife nor the mother of his children. In 1910, Frank, 36, lived on the same tract with then wife Margaret, 25, and two children. Father Jacob H. lived with them. Frank was a farmer. Margaret reported having had no children, so if correct, the mother of both children was Clara.®801

Ten years later in 1920, Frank's family consisted of wife Margaret, his two children and John and Howard Stoney, nephews age 3 and 1. Daughter Lillian was a teacher. Frank owned his own farm. ®803

Earl registered for the World War I draft 5 June 1917. He was 21 years old and living with and working for his brother William as a farm laborer in Cummings, Bingham, ND. Presumably this was the family farm that William took over when father Alonzo died. Earl described himself as tall, of medium build with brown hair and brown eyes.®675

A year later Earl enlisted in the Navy at Fargo, ND and was sent to the Great Lakes Naval Training Station in Illinois. From there he went to Hampton Roads Naval Training Station as a Seaman 2nd Class. He served 140 days and was released from active duty at Minneapolis on 19 May 1919 and discharged 30 September 1921.®821

After his release from active duty, Earl returned to live with his brother, Ben, in Bowman, ND. He was enumerated there on the 1920 census. He worked as a laborer in the lumber yard where Ben worked.®818

On May 30, 2006, Hiram Bingham IV was awarded a US commemorative stamp bearing his image as a distinguished diplomat. His sixth child, Robert Kim Bingham, launched a stamp drive in 1998 to urge the US Postal Service to issue a postage stamp in honor of his father. The campaign gained wide bipartisan support in the US Congress and, after six years, it succeeded.

Bingham did not speak much about his wartime activities. His own family had no knowledge of them until after Hiram's death when his youngest son discovered a tightly wrapped bundle of letters, documents, and photographs in a cupboard behind a chimney in the family home. The bundle told of Bingham's struggle to save German and Jewish refugees from death, details long hidden by the United States government.

In 1939, Hiram had been posted to the US Consulate in Marseille, where he and another vice-consul named Miles Standish, were in charge of issuing entry visas to the USA. On June 10, 1940 Nazi forces invaded France. The French government fell and a puppet government signed an armistice with Germany. In part, the French agreed to "surrender on demand all Germans named by the German government in France." Civil and military police began to roundup German and Jewish refugees whom the Nazi's had marked for death. Several influential Europeans tried to lobby the American government to issue visas so that German and Jewish refugees could freely leave France and escape persecution.



Anxious to limit immigration to the United States and to maintain good relations with the puppet or Vichy government, the State Department actively discouraged diplomats from helping refugees. However, Bingham and Standish cooperated with Varian Fry, who ran a rescue network, and issued visas, legal and illegal, enabling refugees to escape France. Among those they helped Fry to rescue were famous authors and artists: Leon Feuchtwanger, Franz Werfel, Alma Mahler Werfel, Heinrich and Golo Mann (son and brother of Thomas Mann), Max Ernst, Marc Chagall, Andre Breton, Andre Masson, Otto Meyerhof, Konrad Heiden, and Hannah Arendt.

Hiram also sheltered Jews in his Marseilles home, and obtained forged identity papers to help Jews in their dangerous journeys across Europe. He worked with the French underground to smuggle Jews out of France into Franco's Spain or across the Mediterranean and even contributed to their expenses out of his own pocket. All told, as US Vice Consul in France during World War II, Hiram Bingham IV helped save over 2500 lives by granting Jews visas to escape the country.

On June 27, 2002, U.S. Secretary of State, Colin Powell, praised Bingham's "constructive dissent" and presented a posthumous "courageous diplomat" award to his children at an American Foreign Service Officers Association awards ceremony. Hiram received two



additional honors in the fall of 2006: On October 27, 2006, the Anti-Defamation League posthumously presented to Hiram ("Harry") its "Courage to Care" award (previous recipients include Oskar Schindler, Chiune Sugihara, and "The People of Denmark," et al), at the ADL's national conference in Atlanta. In November 2006, the United States Episcopal Church added Hiram Bingham IV to its list of "American Saints," with a summation of his life and character in the book "A Year with American Saints."

But, in 1941 the United States government had abruptly pulled Hiram from his position as Vice Consul and transferred him to Portugal and then Argentina. When he was in Argentina, he helped to track Nazi war criminals in South America. In 1945, he was forced to retire from the United States Foreign Service.

Hiram's first assignment in the United States Foreign Service had been in Beijing, China. There, he witnessed the beginnings of the communist revolution. His travels through Asia piqued his interest in eastern religious philosophy. Hiram spent the rest of his life trying to reconcile eastern religious philosophies with that of the Christian traditions his family had been historically known to preach. Hiram also served in Warsaw, Poland.

In 1934, while serving as third secretary to the United States Embassy in London Hiram met Rose Lawton Morrison, a college drama teacher from Waycross, Georgia. He had the honor of escorting Rose to Buckingham Palace to meet the Queen. Eventually Hiram and Rose married and had eleven children. The couple lived to see over forty of their grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

As a child, Heil lived in Iowa and Minnesota before moving to North Dakota, probably with his parents when they homesteaded about 1884. Heil, himself, patented 152.13 acres in three segments by outright purchase in 1891 when he was 24.®773 He probably married in that year or soon thereafter. His first child was born in 1894.

The Homestead Act allowed a patentee to claim an additional 160 acres by timber culture provided they plant and cultivate 10 acres of timber. Since Heil's father John had homesteaded, it was probably under his claim that Heil patented an additional 160 acres under the Timber Culture Act in 1898.®774 By 1900, Heil, wife and four children lived in Verner, Sargent, North Dakota. They had two hired farm hands and Heil owned his own farm free of mortgage.®765

By 1910, Heil and family had moved into town. They lived in Oakes Ward 3, Dickey, North Dakota just west of Verner, Sargent County. Their six children ranged in age from 16 years to 21 months. Heil reported to the census taker that he had his own income and owned his house free of mortgage. ®766

Ten year later, Heil still lived in Oakes with his wife. Only his two youngest children were still at home. At age 52 he called himself a retired farmer.®768
