A few comments from the editor

Brendan J. O'Donnell (great, great, grandson of Clarissa Bingham 1.10a.2b.1.1.3.), has finished a complicated piece of research on one of his Bingham ancestors and shares his findings here in a concise and easy to understand discussion. Read on, learn, and applaud!

“One of the family mysteries is the inconsistency between the birth date of Herbert MacKay Bingham Jr. (1.10a.2b.1.1.8.2b.1.) of 12 Nov 1901 and the marriage of his parents (Herbert MacKay Bingham Sr and Cornelia Strassburg Carroll) on 25 October 1909.

Herbert Sr.'s first wife, Kate Price, died in 1904 leaving daughters Dorothy and Kathryn. Cornelia was the daughter of August Strassburg and Caroline Ruppert and married William Joseph Carroll in Manhattan on 11 February 1901 (marriage cert.)

The 1910 census lists Herbert Sr. and Cornelia in Manhattan with five children: Dorothy, Kathryn, August J. (age 8), William J. (age 6), and J. Ruppert (age 6). The three boys reflect names from Cornelia's family and first husband and the latter two were probably twins.

Herbert Sr. died in 1914 and the 1920 census lists Cornelia with three sons: Herbert M. (age 18), J. Ruppert (age 16) and Stuart A. (age 16). August J. had thus changed his name to Herbert M. and William J. had changed his to Stuart A.

Cornelia married Joseph Oppenheimer of Butte, Montana in 1921 and Joseph is listed in the Montana death index as dying on 31 January 1924. In the 1930 census, Cornelia was married

to James Bruce (Bruce J.) Kremer and living in Butte with sons Herbert M. (age 28), Ruppert (age 26), and Stuart (age 26); all three with last name Bingham.

The New York City birth index includes a record for August J. Carroll, born in Manhattan on 12 November 1901, the same birth date as Herbert M. Bingham Jr. It seems apparent that Cornelia's three sons were from her first marriage and were later adopted by Herbert M. Bingham Sr.

Cornelia and Bruce moved to Washington DC by 1940 where Bruce died on 23 July 1940 (obit). Cornelia died 15 May 1974 (obit) at age 92 and is buried with Bruce in Rock Creek Cemetery."

Hannah, the oldest child of Lemuel and Hannah Perkins Bingham was born in the Scotland section of Windham. At the age of eighteen she married Joshua Lasell as his second wife. [Joshua's son by his first wife died the day he was born 16 Mar 1753.®865] They first lived in Windham and had five children whose births were recorded in the Windham records between 1757 and 1765. One died in infancy. Hannah and Joshua next lived in the "Horse Neck" area of Norwich where two more children were born and baptised. In 1772 the family moved to Nobletown where the last two children were born. Before 1790 they moved to Lanesborough, Berkshire, MA where they were enumerated on the first federal census. At that time, two sons over 16, one son under sixteen, and one daughter lived at home. Their son Bingham Lassell was baptised by the Rev. Gideon Bostwick in Lanesborough.®553: Remarkable Records of Rev. Gideon Bostwick, 1770-1793. Great Barrington, MA Both Hannah and Joshua died and were buried in Lanesborough.

Edward was the fourth son of Elisha and Hannah Slapp Bingham. His mother died when he was sixteen. A few years later, in 1797, his father and brothers, Elias and Abel, left Enfield, NH and moved to Jay, Essex Co NY. Edward probably remained on the farm with brother Alfrad; at least he paid taxes in Lebanon NH 1797 to 1801. Thereafter, he lived in Jay, Essex, NY, also, where he married Almira Hooker, about 1804 when she was sixteen. In 1810, Edward and family were enumerated in Jay with two males and one female under ten. His father, Elisha, may have lived with him at the time.@136: 17 During the War of 1812 Edward served in Sanford's Unregimented Battalion, New York Militia at the rank of Private.@310, Roll Box 17

Edward and family moved to Spencer, Tioga County between 1820 and 1830 where he lived until he died shortly before the 1860 census was taken.@115: 145, @150: 113, @92: 108; @830 One report claims that Edward may have had as many as twelve children, but only six males other than himself and wife Almira were attributed to him on the 1830 census when Edward was 54 years old. Sons Ira and Seth also lived in Spencer at the time. Samuel, Henry and Abel moved to IL, Daniel died age 17. Edward died age eighty-two in 1858. After Edward died, Almira lived with son Seth in Danby, Tompkins, NY.

After marriage, Caty and John lived in Madison Co, NY, where their eleven children were born. In 1837 when Caty was 51 years old, she and John moved to Will County, IL. Their son George, their sixth child, had moved to Chicago in 1836 where he spent the winter searching for land. He found tracts in Will County where he and father John bought in June, 1837. John and Caty lived in Will County the rest of their lives. George was the only surviving child. @1041

Susan was 11 years old when she moved with her family to Ellsworth, Trumbull County, OH from Sprague, New London, CT. She was 19 when she married John Kirk and he was 22. John had already been in the mercantile business in Youngstown for five years. When the 1830 census was taken, they were both between 20 and 30 and daughter Alice was their only child. One male age 15-20 lived with them. The 1840 census accounts for Alice, Henry or Thomas, Mary, and Maria and one male age 20-30 in addition to John age 30-40 and Susan, also age 30-40. By 1850 John was a clerk working for a well known iron foundry firm in Pittsburgh: Jones and Laughlin. He traveled throughout the Ohio Valley and into Illinois doing business on the company's behalf. The family retained their home in Youngstown, now Mahoning County, Ohio where they raised their children, seven of whom were alive and at home in 1850. The youngest, Rufus Lord Kirk, was born in December 1850. When Rufus was 7 years old John and Susan Kirk moved to Chicago. John opened a warehouse there for Jones and Laughlin and ran it for five years. The family was not enumerated in 1860. John left Jones and Laughlin in 1862 and moved to Mercer County, PA where he worked in agriculture for two years. In 1864, the family returned to Chicago so John could use the city as his center of operations as a commercial representative for several eastern iron manufacturing companies. In 1870 the two youngest children, Ellen and Rufus, were still at home and Gurdon Bingham, Susan's nephew (son of Susan's brother Lemuel) age 26 lived with them and worked as a clerk for John. Susan died in 1872, two years before John retired. John married again about 1874, a woman named Ann and moved to Jacksonville, Morgan County IL where he lived until he died in 1891.@964

Susan's sons Thomas J. Kirk and Rufus L. Kirk continued in the iron business. Thomas was the senior partner in the firm Kirk, Coleman & Company, dealers in iron and heavy hardware. Rufus was an accountant. Through time the company was known as Thomas J. Kirk & Company, Kirk and Barker, The Kirk Iron and Hardware Company, and The Wick and Bonnell Company. In 1882, Rufus became an accountant with S.D. Kimbark.@964

Ira was probably Edward's oldest son. The 1830 census attributes one 20-30 year old household member to Edward. If this is Ira, it would place Ira's birth between 1800 and 1810 which would fit with his parent's approximate marriage date and his younger brother's known birth dates. Furthermore, the 1840 census shows that Ira and his wife were both between 30 and 40 years of age. The confusing issue is the time span of nine years between Ira's birth and his next sibling. The 1830 census indicates more than five years. That census also records only male siblings. Ira was probably born in Jay, Essex Co NY about 1808 and moved to Spencer by 1830. He was enumerated on the 1840 census with one male child 10-15 and two female children 5-10.<sup>150</sup>: 113 This would account for his two oldest daughters on the 1850 census, but the son is missing. Furthermore, Ira is also missing from the 1850 and all succeeding censuses. Only Sally and the children appear.<sup>92</sup>: 108 Both Hall in her transcription and FindaGrave.com show that Ira was born in 1808 and died in 1849.

If Sally's father was Elisha Holdridge as indicated in the Historical Gazetteer of Tioga County, New York, then Sally was born in Bridgewater, Susquehanna County, PA. Holdridge moved his family to Spencer, Tioga, NY between 1820 and 1830 when Sally would have been between the ages of 13 and 23. She would have met and married Ira shortly after arriving in Spencer.

After Ira died, Sally married James Tompkins. Tompkins had been born in England about 1814 and may have been related to the many Tompkins in Tioga and Tompkins Counties, NY. The 1860 census shows Sally, age 53, and daughter Mary (age given as 18 and surname spelled Brigham) living with Tompkins and three others (Mary Cashman, 18; W.H. Cashman, 17; Liddy Forsythe, 19). However, in 1870, Sally is not living with Tompkins, but with son Ira Augustus and his family in Spencer. Sally's son Seth and daughter Sarah A. also live with Ira Augustus. The 1880 census for Spencer is not available so we can't say where Sally was then living. All we know is that she was buried in the Baptist Corner's Cemetery where Ira had been buried.

Samuel lived in Newark Twp, Kendall Co, IL for 62 years, but before arriving in IL he lived in Tompkins Co, NY and Spencer, Tioga Co, NY. where his oldest child, daughter Rachel A. was born in 1839 and died in 1841. Then in 1843 Samuel, wife Harriet and 2 year old Martin moved to Newark, Kendall Co, IL to join his father-in-law Henry Gridley. We know that Samuel arrived in 1843 because his third child, daughter Margaret A. died that year and was buried in Millington-Newark Cemetery. Samuel bought a village lot about 1844 and built a house where he lived the rest of his life. In the Biographical Directory of Kendall County Samuel is listed as a Boot and Shoemaker, and an independent republican and a baptist.<sup>898</sup>, <sup>912</sup> He had one unfortunate incident with his business. In March 1868 a fire in the center of Newark destroyed Manchester's drug store, Winchell's Hardware, and Bingham's shoe store.<sup>901</sup>, p. 374 After Samuel's wife died in 1885, son Martin continued to live at home, unemployed, and in 1900 Samuel's daughter Mary E. Saunders also lived with him.

Henry followed his older brother, Samuel to Newark, Big Grove Twp, Kendall Co, IL arriving in 1845.<sup>901</sup>, p. 249 Henry was also a shoe maker and the 1850 census shows him, age 27, living with brother Samuel and family and using the name

Harry. In 1851, Henry married Samuel's wife's sister, Mary Louis Gridley and by July 7, 1860 when the federal census was taken, they had three children. The youngest, Samuel, just one month old, apparently died very young as there does not seem to be a cemetery record for him and he was not part of the family on the 1870 census.

Henry quit the shoe making trade before 1880 and became a farmer in Fox Twp, Kendall County. Fox is located due west of Kendall. Two children were at home in 1880, William H. and Minnie (Mary) E. In 1900 Henry and Mary lived with son William and daughter Minnie in Afton Township, Dekalb County where William was farming. In 1901, Henry and Mary moved to near South Haven, MI. Henry died and was buried there in 1902. Mary spent the rest of her life in Shabbona, IL mainly with youngest daughter Minnie who did not marry.

Seth and Anna Eliza had not been married long when the 1850 census was taken in Spencer, Tioga Co NY as they had no children. Twenty years later, in 1870, they lived in Danby, Tompkins Co NY, a few miles north of Spencer. Their daughter, Frances (Frankie) had just married; sons John and Spencer were at home. Seth's mother, Almira, age 82, also lived with them. By 1880, Almira had died and the sons were no longer living at home, but daughter, Frankie D. Spaulding (Spaulding) and grandson, Benny S. Spaulding (Spaulding) lived with them. Seth was farming. Son John was married and lived on a nearby farm. After Anna Eliza died in 1892, Seth moved in with daughter Frances and family in Spencer, Tioga, NY.

Abel C., or A.C. as he was called, was a physician and practiced in Harvard, McHenry, IL northwest of Chicago. In 1860, he lived in Alden. As a physician he was privileged to pay a license tax of \$10.00 on his profession in 1862 to help pay for the Civil War. In 1864 he paid the same annual tax on his profession as well as a \$1.00 tax on his new carriage, considered to be a luxury item. In 1865 his tax jumped to \$22.80: \$10.00 for the professional license, \$1 on the carriage, \$1 on a gold watch - another luxury item - and \$10.80 or 5% of \$216, the amount he earned over \$10,000.

After the war, Abel's income continued to increase. In 1870 he claimed a value of \$13,300.00 on his real estate and \$2,200.00 on his personal estate. Abel's family increased, also. He and Estelle had two daughters, Angie, age 4, and Lena age 4 months. Over the next decade, Abel's family doubled in size. At age fifty, Abel was the father of four daughters and the family had a servant girl from Prussia.

A. C.'s wife, Estelle, died before 1900. The online Illinois Death Index does not yet contain a record for her. A.C. was 70 years old and daughters Cassie and Amy C. lived at home. Cassie was a postal clerk and Amy worked at the telephone exchange.

Six years later, 1906, A.C. died age 78. The daughters moved into Chicago to live with their widowed sister Angeline. She worked as an office clerk for a publishing house and she got sister Cassie a job as bookkeeper with the same publishing house. Sister Amy C. found a job as a stenographer in an architect's office. After 1910, we lose track of the girls.

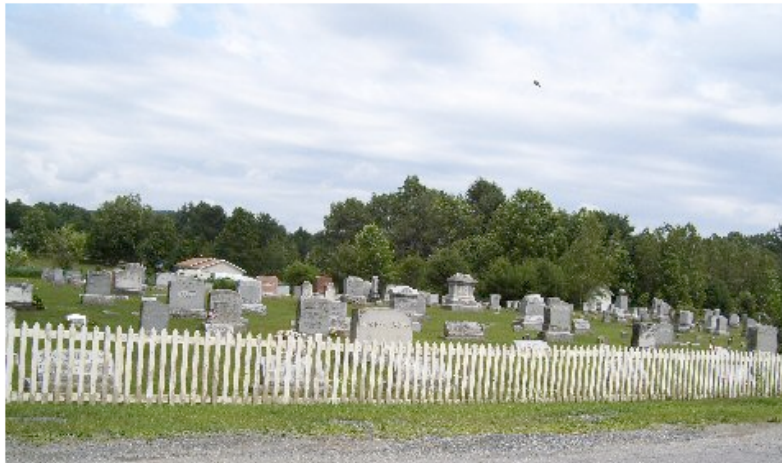

In 1874 and 1876 William H.H. was the Democrat candidate for governor.®833, ®834 Unsuccessful in his bids, he moved his business headquarters to Montpelier in 1877 and was elected president of the Vermont Mutual Fire Insurance Company. In 1878 he ran for governor one last time, but could not overcome the strength of the Republican party in VT. That same year he became one of the directors of the state prison and house of corrections. He and Orpha had no children.

Barbara Baraw, president of the Stowe Historical Society wrote on 23 March 2008, "We have a 'Boat load of information' on the notorious W.H.H. including the history of the home he built on Main street, his holding mortgages for many town folks, his life as an attorney, his convincing the town to pay for a road half way up Mt Mansfield to his half way house/hotel, his building an hotel on top of Mt Mansfield the highest mountain in VT in 1858 before the one that took up 4 blocks in the village which was built in 1863 and burned to the ground Oct 29, 1889, and the Notch house/hotel that he built in 1869 that was open for 7 years until the porcupines chewed too much of it. Myth has it that he was known as 'Gov' because of the times he ran for governor and didn't win."

Barbara went on to say that the Big Hotel was not solvent for much of its existence. She has started to collect the land and corporate records following its ups and downs and is plotting the various lands WHH once owned at one time or another. He gave 1.5 acres to the village district to build a school with the caveat that a fence be around it at all times. That didn't last more than his lifetime. The school was used from 1861 until 1973 and is now the home of the Stowe Free Library and Helen Day Art Center.

The next time you drive to VT, stop by the Stowe Historical Society to say hello and to thank Barbara Baraw, Patricia Haslam, retired CG, and all others for the work they're doing on the Bingham (4 sons of Elias settled in Lamoille County) and their help.

Leander became the principal son in the family printers' rollers business, Samuel Bingham's Sons and variants, from 1858 to his death in 1909. In the Civil War, he served briefly on two occasions in Company I of the 12<sup>th</sup> New York Militia Infantry: as a lieutenant for three months in 1861 and as a captain for one month in 1863. (military record) He lived in Manhattan and was wealthy enough to have one live-in servant in 1880 and two in 1900. Three of his sons, Charles, Herbert, and Frederick, later ran the New York portion of the company.

In the Civil War, he served one month in 1863 with Company I, 12<sup>th</sup> New York Militia Infantry (with brother Leander) and 100 days in 1864 with Company A, 102<sup>nd</sup> New York National Guard Infantry in Elmira NY. (military record) Shortly after his father died, Millard left New York City to settle in Chicago and set up a branch of the family business manufacturing printers' rollers. His company did not operate under the same name as his brothers' in NYC, but was called Sam'l Bingham's Son Mfg. Co. In 1890 he was enumerated there as a resident.@697 Wife Florinda applied for an invalid pension on July 15, 1889 and for a widow's pension on May 16, 1891. Brother George A. Bedell, husband of Florinda's sister, Miranda, was Ezra's guardian.@717

Sometime in the mid 1870s, Ezra and family lived in Kansas where son Elbert Eugene was born in 1874. Ezra and family returned to Lorraine, Henry, IL where he was a farmer and they were enumerated on the 1880 census, but left again after 1885 and moved to Nebraska. Lorraine, IL. A Nebraska Tract Book search shows Ezra M. Bedell owning land in sec 30, Twp 13, R 38W [Reel 11 or 12]. In less than 5 years, Ezra was a patient in the Nebraska Soldiers and Sailor's Home in Grand Island where he died in 1891.

Florinda remarried, but the date is needed. Her second husband was Andrew Jackson Britton and he had a son, Roy W. just three years younger than Florinda's Roger Sherman. They moved to Miami, Ottawa Nation, Indian Territory where they were enumerated on the 1900 census.@892 Andrew worked as a laborer most of the time and they lived there for the rest of their lives.

Ira Augustus, fifth child, but oldest son of Ira and Sally Holdridge Bingham was first enumerated on the 1870 federal census. He lived on a farm in Spencer with wife, Eliza, and son Ira W. His sister Sarah A. and brother Seth H. lived with him, and also his mother, Sally Tompkins, who had married second, James Tompkins. By 1887-88 Ira was farming 250 acres in Spencer.<sup>830</sup> Wife Eliza Jane had died in 1883 and Ira A. had married second, Alzoa, surname unknown, but she died in 1901 age 45. By 1900 the only child left at home was son Arthur Garfield, age 20.<sup>1007</sup> Ira A. married third, Elsie Ann Watson in 1902. Elsie had a daughter Ruth Watson who in 1910 was a teacher, but in 1920 was a Doctor of Osteopathy. The three lived in Spencer and at age 75 Ira was still working as a retail merchant selling machinery and fertilizer.

Martin lived at home with parents and worked as a laborer in Newark until his father died in 1907.<sup>898</sup>, p. 85. Martin's sister, Mary E. Bingham Saunders, had been living at home, also, since before 1900. The two siblings remained together and in 1910 school teacher Charles Holley boarded with them. Mary, age 63, was head of household. Martin was 70.<sup>977</sup> Mary died in 1919 so Martin then went to live with cousin Marshal Bagwill and family and Marshal's unmarried sister Emily Bagwill. The Bagwills lived in Mission, LaSalle, IL.<sup>976</sup> Presumably, Martin remained there until his death in 1925.

Sarah was 19 when she married Martin Wilson in 1863. He was 27 and a tin smith by trade.<sup>980</sup> He was also a Civil War veteran having enlisted for a three year term on 7 Aug 1861 and assigned to company F, 36th Illinois US Infantry where he served as 2nd Lieutenant.<sup>981</sup> The Thirty-sixth Infantry was organized at Camp Hammond, near Aurora, IL. The regiment went to St. Louis for rifles and muskets and then into camp at Rolla, MO until the middle of January, 1862. It then moved to near Bentonville, AR where companies B and K participated in battles at Leestown and Pear Ridge, March 7 and 8. The regiment then camped at Keltsville Mo with other regiments comprising Col. Osterhaus' Brigade.<sup>982</sup> At this point Martin resigned and returned home.<sup>981</sup>

The Illinois state census for 1865 shows Martin, Sarah, and baby Grant living near her father, Samuel.<sup>983</sup> Within the next five years the family moved to Rutland, LaSalle County, west of Kendall, where they were enumerated on the 1870 census. Martin was still working as a "tinner" and daughter Lulu was 4 years old.<sup>984</sup>

Martin gave up tinning to become a hardware merchant in Marseilles, La Salle County before 1880. By then, both of his parents had come to live with his family and his father at 75 was clerking in the hardware store.<sup>985</sup>

We don't find Sarah and Martin again until 1910 when they are living in Aurora Ward 2, Kane County, IL. They had been married 47 years and son Grant, age 45, still lived with them. A fourth household member, Lilly Itckenburger is listed as a step-daughter, born in KS, working as a dressmaker. Sarah is named "Sallie", and is 65. Martin is 73.<sup>986</sup> We do not know where or when they died, what happened to Grant, nor who Lilly actually was.

In 1910, after their father died, Mary and Martin were still living together, Mary as head with her own income.<sup>977</sup> Mary died in 1919.

She called herself Lida and that may well have been her original name. Lida and Charles had two children and apparently lived in Millington all of the time. Millington straddles the boarder between Kendall and La Salle counties and each portion forms part of a different statistical reporting area. Deeds need to be checked to know exactly where Lida and Charles Crum lived.<sup>991, 992, 993, 994, 995</sup>

Charles had moved to Newark, Kendall County with his parents in 1856. The parents bought land in Fox Township and Charles lived there until he was twenty-one. In 1876, he bought the farm from his parents, but sold it in 1886 and bought 130 acres of improved property adjacent to the town of Newark. He later added 40 more acres. His main farming interest was in sheep and hogs. Charles belonged to the Republican party and served as a School Director for many years.<sup>900</sup>

William's mothers' obituary of 1909 did not mention a wife and child, but named Howard City, MI as William's home. Howard City is in Reynolds Township. William and Cora had another child, a son, La Verne, born about 1911. WHERE was La Verne born, MI or OH? William and Cora next appear in Toledo, Lucas, OH where he was working as a printer in 1920.

Frances went by the name Frankie much of the time and husband John Smith Spaulding had gone by the name Smith since childhood as revealed on the 1860 federal census when he was 8 years old.<sup>947</sup> In 1870, six months after they were married, they lived in the dwelling next to John Smith’s father, Benjamin Spaulding.<sup>948</sup> Where Smith was in 1880 is not known, perhaps at home in Spencer, but Frances and son Benny S. were living with her parents in Danby, Tompkins, NY.<sup>949</sup> Son Leon was born in 1892 and in 1900 the family, minus son Benny, was enumerated in Spencer. Frances’ father Seth, then a widower, lived with them.<sup>946</sup> Smith was not at home to be enumerated in 1910, but Frances and son Leon had a seventy year old boarder, George Whitney.<sup>950</sup> In 1920, Smith was at home, as was Frances. No one else lived with them. We do not know when either of them died, nor have we found either son.

John worked as a day laborer.<sup>951</sup> In 1910 John was the proprietor of a second hand business and son Seth lived at home.<sup>953</sup> John died before 1920 when the census shows Amanda living alone in the dwelling next to son, Seth.<sup>952</sup>

Ira and Stella C. were married by 1880 when they were enumerated on the federal census living in Ithaca, Tompkins, NY next to Stella’s father. Ira worked on the farm.<sup>956</sup> They may have had three sons as some have claimed, but in 1900 Stella claimed no children and she and Ira were divorced. Stella was a farmer in Ithaca Township and had one lodger.<sup>957</sup> <sup>958</sup> The following information needs to be verified: From the census we may deduce that Ira moved to Chicago and took a job as a teamster. He lived in a dwelling on Wells Street. Brother “Spence” and a female named Clara and called “sister” lived with Ira. Spence also worked as a teamster.<sup>963</sup> However, a Spencer Bingham living in a boarding house and working as a laborer also was enumerated in Chicago in 1900. We do not know if they are one and the same as neither has been found on any later census. In 1910 Ira was recorded as a widower. He lodged on Washington Boulevard and worked as a roofer. No Spencer or Clara were to be found. Presuming that this is the correct Ira, based mainly upon age and the few Bingham with the same name, Ira remarried before 1920. His wife, Fannie, age 49, was born in KY. Ira still worked as a roofer. Cook County records a death for an Ira on 6 July 1924. His body could have been removed to Evergreen Cemetery, Spencer, Tioga, NY and buried there in 1925.

and working as a teamster. A female, Clara Bingham, recorded as sister lives with them. We can't identify Clara. Spencer then disappears from the censuses and other records online.

The family moved to Oak Grove, Dodge County, Wisconsin before 1848, where in that year O.G.W. was practicing medicine in Beaver Dam.@938, p. 166 He had been there long enough to be honored as one of three speakers at meeting of free soil sympathizers held at Clason Prairie on 28 August 1848.@938, p. 200

Ozro is missing from the 1850 census, but in 1860 he, wife Mary Ann and two children, Arthur C. and Romeo were enumerated at Lake Mills, Jefferson County, WI.@1010 Today, I-94 runs just north of Lake Mills. Son Ozro P. was born in 1849 and buried in Rock Lake Cemetery, Lake Mills, Jefferson County. The family moved to Iowa in 1866 and Ozro G.W. died in 1867. His widow and son Arthur remained in Monona through 1870.@1011 Apparently son Arthur moved to Boardman Township after he married for in 1885 he lived there with his wife. His mother-in-law and his own mother lived together in the next dwelling.@905

*Note: Find-a-grave records 2 graves for Bingham in Rock Lake Cemetery. One is for Ozro P. with a birth date of 6 Oct 1849. The other is for death date of 30 May 1865. This could be for the same person or for two different people. We know that son Romeo was 2 years old in 1860 and that he was not alive in 1870 so the second death could be for Romeo born 1858 in WI. This needs to be checked against local WI records not online.*

William H. married while his family lived in Chautauqua Twp, Chautauqua Co NY. He was enumerated there on the 1840 U.S. census.<sup>150: 190</sup> He left NY after his son, [William] Henry, was born in 1843. The family arrived in Na-au-say, Kendall, IL soon after.<sup>901: 233</sup> Many knew him by his middle name, Hurd.<sup>900</sup> His grandson, the son of James Albert also had the middle name Hurd. On 9 May 1846, William patented 160 acres in the SW 1/4 of section 27 and on May 27, 1846 he patented 40 acres in section 28, that is the SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4.<sup>900: 695</sup> In 1848 William bought 200 A more in T36 R8 S27 and 28 in 1848 through the Chicago land office.<sup>510: Document Nos. 22628 IL 1200.097; 22802 IL 1160.073</sup> The 1859 plat map of Kendall County, published two years after William's death, shows the Bingham estate owning acreage in the northwest quarter of section 34.<sup>1014</sup> More research needs to be done on William H.'s land transactions.

The family was enumerated in Na-au-say Twp on the 1850 U. S. census. Henry Bingham, born in PA in 1827, before William H. married, lived with them.<sup>92: 256</sup> Henry was undoubtedly a younger brother. Son, Silas, age 15-16, was enumerated twice, so we know that he was going to school and working as a hired farm hand for Rufus Bohnstead. <sup>92: IL: Will: Wheatland: 52</sup> Brother, Elisha, also settled in Kendall Co.

According to the 1855 IL State Census, William's household then consisted of 1 male under 10 (James), 2 males 10-20 (H. Ozro and Henry), 1 male 20-30 (Silas E.), 1 male 40-50 (Wm. H.); 1 female under 10 [?], 1 female 10-20 (Amanda), 1 female 40-50 (Malvina). After William's death in 1857, we do not know where Malvina lived until 1880 when she appeared on the Washington, Newton, IN census living with son James and family. She was then sixty-three years old.<sup>1040</sup> Since Malvina's grave marker contains no dates, her place and date of death is unknown. Likewise, we do not know where William Hurd is buried, nor his exact date of death.

Note that the *The Bingham Family in the United States* authored by Theodore A. Bingham<sup>1</sup> assigns the wrong children to William Hurd. The correct children are given below.

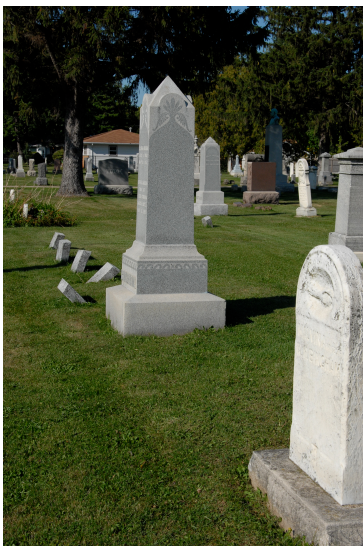

Elisha and Elvira were married in Wayne County, Indiana just before Christmas, 1846.<sup>1114</sup> Within a year their first child, a son, was born, but soon died. Another son, born soon after, died as well. Both were buried in either Wayne or Union counties, Indiana.<sup>1114</sup> The 1850 census shows Elisha's wife, spelled Alvira, and infant son Elisha living in Union, Montgomery, IN with Elisha's sister Mary Jane Terhune and her husband, G.W.<sup>1070</sup> Elisha was not enumerated there because he had gone to California "with a group in quest of gold." On the way home, several in the party died of a deadly fever. Elisha was stricken, but survived.<sup>1114</sup>

In 1851 Elisha and Elvira left Indiana to settle in Naasay Townhip, Kendall Co., IL where Elisha's older brother, William Hurd, lived.<sup>898</sup> Daughter Mary Elinor was born in Naasay in 1852 and son Theodore in 1854, but Mary Elinor died later that year. Elisha and Elvira had another daughter in 1855 and a son in 1858. but brother William Hurd died in 1857. That left Elisha, William H.'s sons, Silas and Hiram Ozro, and Elisha's younger brother, Henry to be enumerated in Naasay in 1860.<sup>83: 95</sup> Elisha, himself, died in 1871.

Elvira was left with three young children and a mortgaged farm of 240 acres in section 26 valued at \$14,000. She kept the farm and worked for sixteen years to pay off the debt. <sup>1114</sup> Apparently she then rented the farm and moved to Plainfield, Will County in 1887. She had transferred church membership to the Plainfield Methodist Church in 1874. She lived in Plainfield the rest of her life. Her granddaughter Nettie and husband Albert Scroggins later lived on the farm, perhaps from their marriage in 1906.

Apparently Elvira kept an open welcome mat. In 1880 her children, Emma and Willard were at home. Niece, Amanda, age 40, daughter of William H., and grandniece, Anna, Amanda's daughter age seven also lived with her and she had a boarder to help with the farm.<sup>172: T746-11</sup> Through all the years, Elvira stayed in touch



with her sister-in-law, Mary Jane Bingham Terhune and from her obtained the birth and marriage dates of brother-in-law William Hurd's children. Elvira gave a copy to Benjamin Thomas Bingham and thus preserved a valuable family set of vital records.®FFB

Elvira lived for 92 years, 1 month, and 27 days. She outlived her Bingham husband and all of her children. She is undoubtedly the one responsible for the family monument in Plainfield Cemetery.

Mary Jane was the eighth of Elisha and Betsey French Bingham's eleven children. She and three or four of her sisters married in Montgomery County, IN in the 1840s.®1100 This could well mean that Elisha and Betsey lived in Indiana in the 1840s and that Elisha died there.

In 1850 Mary Jane was 22 years old and married to Garrett W. Terhune, a surname that has been transcribed in many creative ways. They lived in Union, Montgomery, IN. Brother Elisha's wife, Elvira and her infant son Elisha were enumerated with them.®1070 Elisha was in California seeking gold. (See above 1.9a.2.3.2a.2.5.)

Mary Jane and G.W.'s first son was born in 1852 and in 1859 their second son was born. In 1860 and 1870 the family lived in Rensselaer, Jasper, IN.®1072, ®1073

Before 1880, G.W. decided to try his hand at raising cattle so the family moved to Colfax, Colfax, New Mexico. Son William, already married, moved to Colfax also and lived next door, but son Frank still lived at home.®1074 Mary Jane and G.W. would have been responsible for attracting Mary Jane's nephew, Theodore, to New Mexico in the 1880s. (See below 1.9a.2.3.2a.2.5.4.)

Mary Jane and G.W. left New Mexico before 1900 and moved to Garden City, Finney, KS. Son William had died and his widow, Margaret, 61, and daughter, Maud, 21, moved to Kansas with them and lived next door. Mary Jane was 74 and G.W. was 78.®1101 Son Frank W. and family lived in Sherlock.®1077 G.W. took up the occupation of wagon maker and he and Mary Jane appear in both the 1905 Kansas State Census and the 1910 federal census living in Garden City.®1076 Son Frank W. lived in the same ward with his wife Julia G. and her son Arland W., called adopted son. Frank's occupation was Farm Day Labor.®1075

G.W. died in 1910, but a death date is needed for Mary Jane.®1102

At age sixteen and just twenty-four days after Fort Sumter surrendered to the South, LeRoy enlisted in the Vermont Volunteer Militia 7 May 1861. He was assigned to Company H of the 2nd Infantry Regiment as a Private. For the next three years he saw action and was wounded in both the Battle of Chancellorsville, May 2-4, 1863, and the Battle of The Wilderness, May 5-6, 1864. He mustered out as Corporal on 29 June 1864.<sup>676</sup>, <sup>785</sup> After LeRoy died in 1911, wife Alma applied for a widow's pension.<sup>786</sup>

After the war, LeRoy attended the academy at Stowe, the Normal School at Johnson, VT, and the New Hampton School at Fairfax, VT. He then studied medicine at the University of Vermont and received his M. D. degree in 1870 when he was twenty-five. He remained in Stowe for four more years practicing medicine and acting as Superintendent of Schools. After the birth of his second child he moved his family to Burlington, VT where he practiced for his remaining career, mainly as attending surgeon at the Mary Fletcher Hospital. He was also Surgeon General of the State of Vermont in 1880 and on the Anatomy and Surgery faculty of the University of Vermont Medical School.<sup>833</sup>, pp. 282-84 The family lived at 110 College Street in Burlington, but by 1910 lived at 49 Williams Street.<sup>822</sup>

After LeRoy's death, widow Alma and daughter Amy moved to 165 Prospect where they were in 1916.<sup>841</sup>

Amy Leona went by the name of Leona A. She lived at home in Fletcher, probably until both of her parents died. In 1900 she was head of the household that included her younger sister Emma and Emma's husband Horace Thomas. [Note that as of 4 April 2008 these names were transcribed incorrectly in the Ancestry.com version of the U.S. Census for 1900. Leona was Leo and Thomas was Dhamas.] Leona was listed as a merchant of general merchandise.<sup>849</sup> She continued in this occupation through 1910 when nephew Leroy T. Kinsley lived with her and worked as a clerk in a hardware store.<sup>850</sup> Perhaps this was Leona's store? He was assigned to Company F, 8th Infantry Regiment on 18 February 1862. He was discharged for promotion to Full 2nd Lieutenant and commissioned in Company B, 74th Infantry Regiment U.S. Colored Troops on 1 October 1863. He remained with the Colored troops until he resigned from the army 18 July 1865.<sup>676</sup> Rufus returned to live with the Montagues where in 1870 he was again enumerated as a farm laborer.<sup>854</sup>

On the Special Schedule of surviving Civil War veterans taken in 1890, Rufus claimed a total length of service of 3 years, 7 months, 14 days. He also claimed injury to his legs and ribs and that he had incurred chronic diarrhea, the most common complaint of all veterans. <sup>564</sup>, Roll 105, p. 1.

Ella and Rufus were married in 1872 and had seven children in the next eleven years, six boys and one girl. On their farm, actually located in Lowell, they had 17 dairy cows and a sugar orchard of 500 trees.<sup>855</sup>

Five of the children were still living at home in 1900. Daughter Amy, at 24, was a teacher and Lester, at 22, was at school. Leroy worked in a shop and Guy worked on the farm.

Ella died in 1909, but in 1910 Rufus and the two youngest boys were still working the farm.<sup>856</sup>

So far, the earliest information we have on Elbert is his 1908 application for a passport. He gave his residence as Detroit, MI and occupation as chemical engineer. Between the 1870 census for Spencer, Tioga, NY, taken when Ira was 10 months old and the 1920 census taken when Ira was a farm manager in Louisiana, we have not found a record for him other than his marriage to Lula May Bess Root in 1913 in Louisiana. A granddaughter, Carol Bingham Hicks, noted that her father, that is, the son of this Ira Wilcox was born in WI in 1915 and that he and his parents moved to Louisiana from Portage WI in 1917.<sup>1003</sup> That places this Ira Wilcox in WI in 1915. Most accurately, they did not move to LA in 1917, but they *moved back* to Louisiana in 1917 since this Ira Wilcox was in LA in 1913 to marry Lula Root. We have no further information about Lewis until 1910 when he was 34 years old and married with one newborn child. He and family lived in Kirksville, MO. The census taker recorded that he had no occupation, which was technically correct for the era.<sup>972</sup> However, he was a student at Kirksville School of Osteopathy, now called the A.T. Still University, Kirksville College of Osteopathic Medicine. Lewis graduated with his Doctorate in Osteopathy that year (1910) and from then on could call himself a D.O.<sup>975</sup>

By 1912 he had returned to NY and set up practice in Ithaca. We know this because his only child at the time, Lewis J. Jr. died in Ithaca 31 Aug 1912, age 2.<sup>970</sup> Lewis and wife Florence had two more children: Marion in 1915 and Wellington in 1917. The family still lived in Ithaca in 1920.<sup>971</sup>

Neither Lewis, Florence, nor Wellington show up on the 1930 federal census so we do not yet know where they were living, then. However, sometime before 1953, when Lewis died, the family moved to Seattle, King, WA. One of Florence's grand

Arthur's first job at age 18 in 1870 was clerk in a dry goods store.@902 He worked as a merchant for the next fifteen years or so, but on the 1900 census he claimed to be a music teacher. He then lived in Alliance, Box Butte, NE.@906

Arthur married in 1875 and lived with his wife in her parent's home in Monona, Clayton, IA. By 1880 he had taken up the lightning rod business and traveled around the midwest selling. In 1880 he was enumerated both in IA and in St Paul, MN in a boarding house. An A. Bingham fitting the vitals for his Uncle Amander (1.9a.2.3.1a.1.2.) was enumerated at the same residence in MN.@903, @904

Arthur moved his wife and daughter Ellen to Boardman Township, Clayton, IA before 1885. His mother and his wife's mother lived together next door.@905 Ellen was born in 1882 as she was 3 years old in 1885. After their stay in Alliance, Box Butte, NE where he was a music teacher in 1900, they settled in Dodge City, Ford, KS before 1910.@893 @908, @907

Silas arrived in Kendall Co. in 1843 with his parents when he was 8 years old. He married in 1856 less than two months before his twenty-first birthday. His wife, Elizabeth was older than he by six years and had been married to John McKewen in 1851. An 1859 plat map of Seward Twp shows Silas with acreage in parts of sections 3 and 10.<sup>1014</sup> The 1876 *Biographical Directory of Kendall County, Illinois* claimed that Silas owned 200 acres in sections 3 and 10 valued at \$10,000, the same location as the 1859 plat map.<sup>898: 68</sup> The 1860 census continues to place Silas and family in Seward Township. His grandmother Betsy Bingham age 71, b. Mass lived with him. Silas was 25, Elizabeth 31, Lucy 3, William 5/12.<sup>628</sup>

When the Civil War broke out, Silas enlisted on September 7, 1861 in Company C, 4th IL Cavalry for a three year period. He was ranked as corporal. He served his three years at the same rank and mustered out November 3, 1864. The regiment fought in the battles of Fort Donelson and Shiloh and then did guard duty in various places until it was sent to Vicksburg where it remained until October 1864.<sup>1016</sup> His Civil War Detail Report describes Silas as 5' 8" tall with black hair and gray eyes.<sup>981</sup>

The 1865 Illinois state census showed Silas back home in Seward Township and the 1870 federal census likewise placed him at home in Seward, Kendall, IL, with both children at home.<sup>983@629</sup> Silas does not seem to be enumerated on the 1880 census and his obituary tells us that he died on 25 Dec 1889.<sup>625</sup>

Wife Elizabeth continued to live on the farm. In 1900 her son, William, and her brother, Isaac Belfield, lived with her. She claimed to have had four children, but only two were living.<sup>1017</sup>

Hiram O. served in Company C, 4th IL US Cavalry during Civil War along with his brother, Silas. Although younger than Silas, he was promoted to Full Sergeant, served his three years, and mustered out 3 November 1864. He was single when he enlisted and described as 5' 10" with black hair and gray eyes.<sup>981</sup> [Note: Other Civil War databases use both Hiram and Harvey for Hiram's first name. In fact, on the federal census he is variously named Hiram O., Harvey O., H.O., and H. Oswell. Dates and names of family members identify him as one and the same.]

After returning home he married Laura Starkweather using the name Harvey O. in 1867.<sup>633</sup> The child Elma, 6 years old in 1870, may or may not have been his daughter and may or may not have been 6 years old.. Harvey/Hiram and family lived in Nausay, Kendall, IL and an Ela Gustin, also 6 and James Bingham, 20, his youngest brother, lived with him.<sup>1018</sup> Laura came from a very large family and the family entry in the 1850 census when Laura was 6 is not clear as to her parents.<sup>1052</sup> In 1860, age 16, Laura and older sister Elizabeth/Lizzie worked as Domestic in the Jas Whitlock household. Whitlock was a farmer in Nausay, Kendal, IL.<sup>1053</sup>

In 1880, under the name H. Oswell, Hiram and family lived in Union, Benton County, IN where he had moved between 1871-1875 judging by the ages of his children and where they were born as recorded on the census.<sup>1019</sup> An Elen M. Preston, 13, and a Silas O. Bingham age 17, b. IL, unidentified, lived with the family.

Wife Laura died in 1891 and Hiram did not remarry. In 1900 we find him visiting or living with daughter Clara in Harrison, Kootenai, ID. His name was written as Harvey O. Bingham, and reported to be a widower and father-in-law of head of household Wayne Bridgeman. Bridgeman's wife, Clair, fits the age and birth place of Hiram's daughter Clara as does Harvey's fit Hiram's. Harvey/Hiram's occupation was "Land Lord." Walter and Clara lived in Harrison ID through at least 1930, but Harvey/Hiram does not appear on later censuses. See Clara's entry for more details.

Amanda married George Gear/Geer when she was 20 years old. 633 He was working as a farm laborer for William Caton in Plainfield, Will, IL. He claimed to be 28 years old and born in Canada, but neither his age nor his birth place were given that way on ensuing censuses until 1920.1059 The couple apparently lived in Illinois through 1869, if the birthplaces of their three oldest children are accurate. By 1870 they had moved to Montana, Labette, KS where they were enumerated on the census. Cousin Lillie/Lilly Bingham (1.9a.3.5a.10a.2.2.), age 18, lived with them and worked as a Domestic.1048 Their fourth child, Anna, was born in Montana, KS in 1873.

Surprisingly, the Kansas State Census taken in March 1875 shows George and the children, but not Amanda.1049 And then we learn that George married Elizabeth Parlette on 5 June 1875.1055 Were it not for the D under marital status after Amanda's name on the 1880 census, we would question the sources. In fact, in 1880, Amanda and daughter Anna lived with Aunt Elvira Bingham, wife of Uncle Elisha in Nausay, Kendall, IL.1036 Daughter Lizzie, age 10, lived in Jackson, Will, IL with 1st cousin Lucy Ann Bingham Shearer. Lizzie was classed as a servant!1047 George Gear and his new wife, Elizabeth, their 3 year old daughter, Josie, and his two sons by Amanda, William and George lived in Labette, KS.1054 Son George died in 1882, but George and Elizabeth had another daughter, Mattie, that same year.682 Next we learn from a very inaccurate newspaper obituary that Elizabeth was killed in an unusual horse and buggy accident in 1888. Son Benjamin Harrison Gear was an infant. Grandmother Catherine Parlett took the baby and changed his name to Gear Parlett.1060 Elizabeth's two daughters probably went to live with other relatives.

Amanda and other family members moved to Joliet, Will, IL and in 1891 lived at 509 Herkimer. Daughter Lizzie and son William H. lived with her. William worked at IL Steel Co.1050 Amanda's brother James Albert also lived with them and worked in 1889 and 1890 at Joliet Steel Plate Co and 1891 at Fox Solid Pressed Steel Co.1051

George and William, both of whom were probably partially responsible for Elizabeth's accident show up in Precinct 6 {Sheridan Lake}, Kiowa, CO in 1900. Both were recorded as widowed and farmers. George owned the farm and house mortgage free. His birth date was recorded as Sep 1836 and birth place as MA.1057 William had married Elizabeth Findlay in 1894. She was from Seward, Kendall, IL. She died in childbirth August 1895 and their infant son died two months later in October. They are both buried in Seward Mound Cemetery, Kendall, IL.897

William H. Gear, widower, remained in Colorado, farming, until he moved to Phoenix, AZ sometime before he died in 1929. On the 1920 federal census, he reported his father's birthplace as Canada and his mother's as New York.1058 His father, George Gear, returned to Montana, Labette, KS where, in 1910 he lived with daughter Jossie Jones, her husband Nicholas W. Jones and their nine children.1056 He died two years later in 1912. His daughter, Mattie/Martha had married photographer John Harris Wright and lived in St. Louis in 1910. Son Benjamin Harrison Gear married and remained in KS.1055

Amanda was only 56 years old when she died in Seward, Kendall, IL, probably while living with daughter Lizzie and John Findlay.

William Henry was a baby when his family arrived in Nausay, Kendall, IL in 1843. He did not serve in the Civil War, but did marry in 1863 when he was 20 years old.897 We cannot find him on the 1870 U.S. Census, so 1880 is the earliest record we have at this time. The family then lived in Union, Benton, IN. William H. worked as a farmer and his three children were at home. The two oldest were born in IL and the youngest in IN so we know that the family lived in IL through 1869 and had moved to IN by Dec 1872.1028

By 1900 at age 56 William was Superintendent of the Benton County Farm and lived in the town of Center. The farm had fifteen inmates. The children were no longer at home.1029

From the County Farm, William went to work on a horse farm in Cass County, IN. In 1910 he was recorded under the name Henry on the federal census. He and wife Eliza lived on Perrysburg Road in Clay.1026

William retired before 1920 and moved to Logansport, Cass, IN where his son James lived three dwellings away.1027

Theodore was Elisha and Elvira's fourth child, but the first to survive beyond the age of three. The middle initial S. stood for Smith. He was 17 years old when his father died in 1871. His mother kept the family farm and the *Biographical Directory of Kendall County* has him and his brother and sister all at home in 1874 or 1875.<sup>898</sup> In 1880, by the time he was 26 years old, Theodore was working as a hired hand on David Morison's farm in Lisbon.<sup>1096</sup>

In Dec 1882 Theodore married Ella M. Beckwith. She was born in NY in 1849. The couple soon went to New Mexico where according to the 1900 census they were in 1887 when daughter Elvira B. was born and her twin brother was stillborn.<sup>1043</sup> For three and a half years Theodore and Ella lived in Raton, near Colfax and aunt Mary Jane Terhune and husband G.W. Terhune. The Terhunes had left Indiana to try raising cattle in New Mexico and probably convinced Theodore that there was work available for a ranch hand. (see 1.9a.2.3.2a.2.8.)

Theodore and Ella returned to Illinois in 1888. The 1900 census places them on Division Street in Plainfield not far from Theodore's mother, Elvira. Theodore had the job of Sexton of the Plainfield Cemetery and his house was next to the cemetery. <sup>1043</sup> Wife Ella died in 1902 and Theodore died four years later in 1906. That left daughter Elvira with no parents age 19, but ten days earlier she had married.<sup>1115</sup>

Harry was still single at age 37 when he appeared on the 1910 U.S. census living in a residence hotel in Waterbury, Washington County, VT. The mine took up to twelve valid minerals out of the ground including talc [[www.mindat.org/loc-22506.html](http://www.mindat.org/loc-22506.html)]. A death certificate would indicate if Harry's death was related to his work in the mine.

Wife Amy lived in Watertown in 1930 with her three children and her mother Ida B. Griffith who worked as a seamstress at the Vermont State Hospital. She also had a lodger and was the census taker.@837

By 1930, Amy had probably moved to NYC and taken a job as a supervisor in the social industry. Her age of fifty-one, her single marital status, and birthplace of Vermont all fit the 1930 census description.@845

We also know that in 1931 Amy went to France and arrived back in NYC on 7 Sept. The ship was the Pennland, pictured here. Amy was the only Burlington and Vermont resident on the ship. Further, we know it was this Amy because her date of birth was listed on the passenger list of U. S. Citizens on the ship. There were only 30 U S Citizens on the ship.@843

**Seth Bingham's** organ works are being recorded by **Christopher Marks** for the Raven CD label as the first integral set of the prolific New York City composer's organ music. The premiere of the series, entitled, Organ Music of Seth Bingham: Vol. 1 Unto The Hills, is currently available online for immediate delivery from [www.RavenCD.com](http://www.RavenCD.com) for \$14.98 with free delivery worldwide, and will be released through record stores and other outlets in May. The complete set of recordings of **Bingham's** organ works are anticipated to comprise two additional CD's.

The first CD volume includes four major suites published in the period 1937 to 1951: *Pastoral Psalms*, op. 30; *Five Pieces*, op. 36; *Baroques*, op. 41; and *Variation Studies*, op. 54. The well-known "Rhythmic Trumpet" and "Bells of Riverside" are among the pieces in these suites that also include similarly colorful works.

"The organ music of **Seth Bingham** (1882-1972) represents a unique intersection between the French symphonic style and an American outlook and sensibility," said **Marks**, "and is evident in the 1923 Casavant organ he designed for his New York church." **Bingham** was organist of Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church in New York City 1913-1951.

The 1923 organ at MAPC was entirely replaced by a new Casavant in 1961, requiring a symphonic organ similar to the original organ on which **Bingham** played to be used for the recording. **Marks** recorded *Unto The Hills* on the very large **Schoenstein** organ of symphonic inspiration built in 1997 at First Plymouth Congregational Church in Lincoln, Nebraska, able to utilize the special tonal and dynamic effects as suggested in the music.

**Marks** said that the great surprise on the first volume is the musical quality of the least known *Variation Studies*, op. 54. "It is hard to imagine why the *Variation Studies* have largely escaped notice," he said. "This well-crafted set of variations on an original theme explores a staggering variety of styles, registrations, and textures. The piece was dedicated to Harold Gleason and edited and fingered by Catharine Crozier."

**Seth Daniels Bingham** composed many works for orchestra, choir, organ, chamber ensembles, and voice throughout a distinguished career as professor of composition at Columbia University 1920-54 and lecturer at the School of Sacred Music of Union Theological Seminary 1953-1965. A student of **Horatio Parker** (composition) and **Harry Benjamin Jepson** (organ) at Yale, he taught theory and composition there from 1907-1919 and received the Heald Prize with poet **Brian Hooker** in 1907 for creating the Yale song, "Mother of Men." In Paris and Berlin 1906-07, he studied with **Vincent d'Indy**, **Alexandre Guilmant**, and **Charles-Marie Widor**, and met and married the musician Blanche Guy of Paris. He returned to France frequently for family visits, allowing him to maintain an active acquaintance with French composers of the time, including **Widor**, **Vierne**, **Dupré**, **Duruflé**, **Langlais**, and others, allowing him to be credited with introducing the French style of organ to the U.S. Though his music shows the influence of these French composers, there is also an unmistakably American quality to his music—the occasional folk-like theme, jazz-influenced harmonies, and in his later music, a certain angularity and dissonance that was part of the mid-century American sound.

He served the American Guild of Organists as vice--president, Chairman of the Convention and Expansion Committee, and as a member of the AGO Examination Committee. He received an honorary doctorate from Ohio Wesleyan University in 1952 and thereafter was known as "Doctor Bingham." according to family members.

**Christopher Marks** is assistant professor of organ at the University of Nebraska, Lincoln, having moved there in 2006 from a similar post at Syracuse University where he had served since 1999. Marks will coordinate the first Pipe Organ Encounter Advanced (for advanced students of the AGO's Pipe Organ Encounters Program) sponsored by the AGO, to be hosted by the Lincoln, Nebraska, Chapter, July 6-11, 2008. An endowed scholarship in memory of **Seth Bingham** helps to support student enrollment in Pipe Organ Encounters.

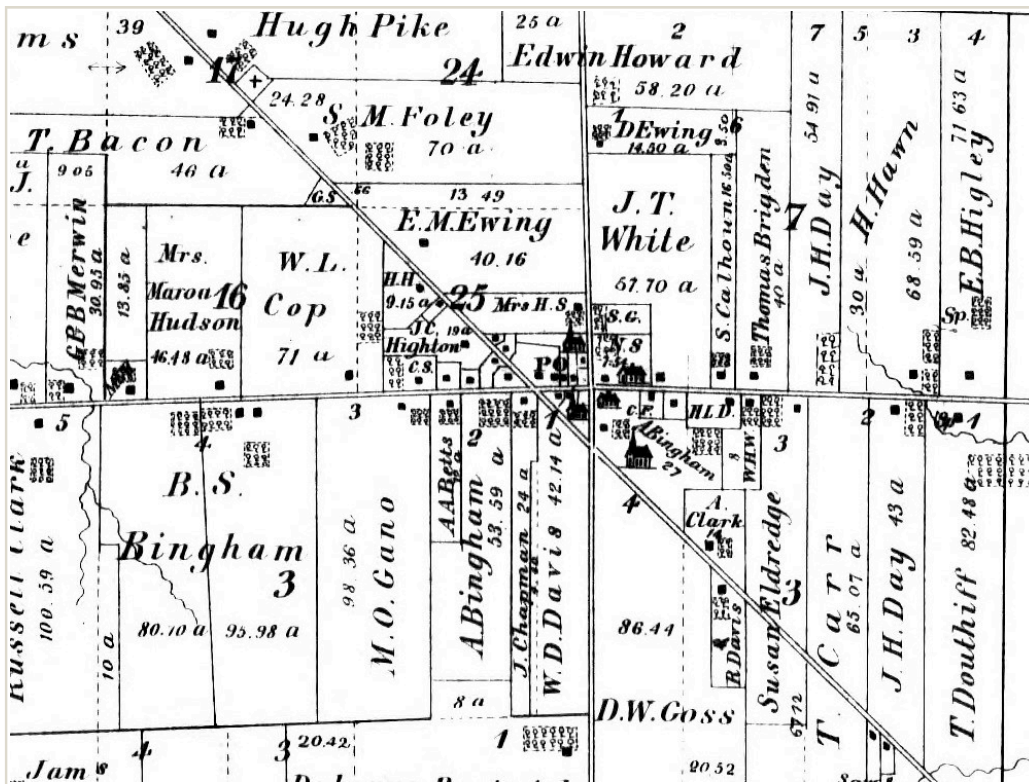

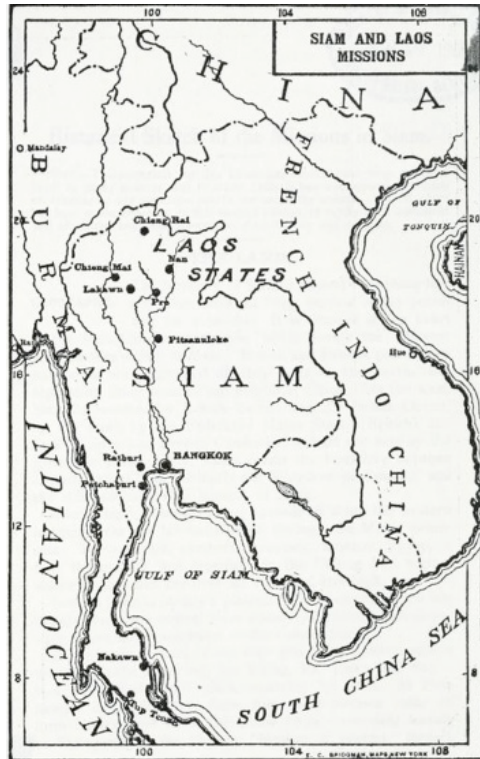
